# PUBLIC NOTICE

June 22, 2005

TO: Parents or guardians of children enrolled at the following school:  
Albert F. Biella Elementary School  
All residential and business neighbors located within 1,000 feet of the proposed new source of air pollution listed below.

FROM: Bay Area Air Quality Management District

RE: Permit Application #12140 for the following source of air pollution:

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The Bay Area Air Quality Management District (the "District") is a local government agency that regulates stationary sources of air pollution such as factories, industrial sites, and gasoline stations.

Whenever we receive a permit application for a new or modified source of toxic air contaminants located within 1,000 feet of a school site, State law requires that we notify the public. To comply with this requirement, we distribute or mail a Public Notice to the parents or guardians of students enrolled at schools located within ¼ mile of the proposed source and all residents and businesses located within 1,000 feet of the proposed source.

You have received this Public Notice because a permit application for the above referenced source of air pollution has been filed with the District. A description of the proposed project follows:

Marlow Partners has applied for a permit to operate a soil vapor extraction system with air emissions abated by carbon adsorption at the site of a former perchloroethylene dry cleaner. This project would be operated continuously until the contaminated soil is cleaned to a level as required by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. Therefore this project source is temporary in nature. Typically projects such as this one are operated for several years, moving to another remediation location once the cleanup is completed.

The District has determined that the increase in health risks resulting from toxic air contaminant emissions from the proposed source are not significant and that the project will comply with all other applicable air pollution control requirements. Accordingly, the District intends to issue a Permit to Operate for the proposed source.
