## **Public Comment Period Begins**

### **Browning-Ferris Los Trancos Canyon Landfill Gets Preliminary OK for Title V Permit**

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District has made a preliminary decision to grant a Title V permit to Browning Ferris Industries of CA Inc., located at 12310 San Mateo Road, in Half Moon Bay, for operation of the Los Trancos Canyon Landfill Facility. The site has two fill areas. The upper canyon area has reached full capacity and has been inactive since 1995, while the lower canyon area is actively accepting waste. The main purpose of this proposed revision is to add three new landfill gas flares to replace three existing ones, which had a history of maintenance problems.

The public comment period is from October 31, 2003 until December 4, 2003. During the public comment period, any member of the public may comment on any aspect of the proposed permit. A copy of the proposed permit can be found:

### **What is Title V?**

Title V is part of the 1990 amendments to the Clean Air Act, and requires all state and local governments to develop and implement operating permits for all major pollution emitting facilities. The EPA oversees these permit programs and the Air District is charged with implementing them in the Bay Area, in accordance with Federal guidelines.

Title V is intended to clarify the complex air quality permitting process by consolidating the multitude of federal, state, and local air pollution control regulations into one summary operating permit that covers all aspects of a facility's year-to-year air pollution activities. The Title V operating permit program is implemented under Air District Regulation 2, Rule 6. Public comment is important to the Title V process. A final decision will incorporate consideration of public comments on the proposal.
