Winter Spare the Air Alert in effect today *Use of wood-burning devices is prohibited*

SAN FRANCISCO – The Bay Area Air Quality Management District is issuing the ninth *Winter Spare the Air Alert* today which bans burning wood, manufactured firelogs or any other solid fuel, both indoors and outdoors, until the alert is lifted.

“Wood burning is the single largest source of wintertime particulate pollution in the Bay Area,” said Jack Broadbent, executive officer of the Air District. “Particulate pollution is associated with a multitude of serious health risks, and is particularly harmful to children, the elderly, and those with respiratory problems.”

It is important for people to check before they burn each day until they hear that the alert is lifted. Residents can check before they burn by calling 1-877-4-NO-BURN or they can sign up for email AirAlerts at www.sparetheair.org or phone alerts by calling 1-800-430-1515.

Air quality in the Bay Area is forecast to be unhealthy. During this *Winter Spare the Air Alert*, it is illegal for Bay Area residents and businesses to use their fireplaces, woodstoves and inserts, pellet stoves, outdoor fire pits, or any other wood-burning devices.
