Mariposa Energy Project Description

The proposed Mariposa Energy Project facility would be a 200-megawatt natural-gas-fired power plant that will be owned and operated by Diamond Generating Corporation, a wholly owned subsidiary of Mitsubishi Corporation.

The facility is a simple-cycle “peaker” power plant that will be used to meet demand for electrical power during short-term peaks in demand. Peaking power plants run during periods of high demand for electricity, most often during the summertime when air conditioning use is highest. The project utilizes four simple-cycle turbines that are designed as a firm supply of power when renewable energy sources such as wind and solar power might not be available. The facility will also have one fire pump.

The proposed Mariposa Energy Project would be located in Alameda County, approximately seven miles northwest of Tracy and seven miles east of Livermore, near the community of Mountain House.

The proposed facility would be located on a 10-acre portion of a 158-acre parcel immediately south of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company Bethany Compressor Station, and the 230-kilovolt Kelso Substation. The address of the land parcel is 4887 Bruns Road, Livermore, California 94550.

Preliminary Determination of Compliance

The Air District’s Preliminary Determination of Compliance describes how the proposed facility would comply with applicable air quality regulatory requirements and proposes permit conditions to ensure compliance, including Best Available Control Technology.

The Air District will review and consider all comments received from the public before deciding whether to issue a Final Determination of Compliance for the proposed project.

The California Energy Commission will use the Air District’s Final Determination of Compliance in conducting an environmental review and determining whether to issue a license for the project.
