Air District & Air Resources Board host “one-stop” diesel truck workshops

SAN FRANCISCO - The Bay Area Air Quality Management District and the California Air Resources Board are co-hosting two Bay Area workshops for diesel truck owners to learn about California’s diesel truck regulations and grant funding opportunities.

These comprehensive, day-long workshops will be held in the cities of Alameda and San Mateo.

“These workshops are a one-stop shop for everything diesel truck owners need to know about clean air regulations and grant and loan opportunities,” said Jack Broadbent, executive officer of the Air District. “The Air District is committed to reducing diesel emissions, which pose a significant threat to public health in our neighborhoods.”

At the workshops attendees will learn which regulations apply to them, what will be required of their equipment and what funding opportunities may be available to them. There will be an inspection demonstration, allowing truck drivers to know what inspectors are looking for during an inspection.

Workshops will cover the following regulations: idling, engine labeling, heavy-duty vehicle inspection program, truck and bus regulation, drayage truck regulation, tractor and trailer greenhouse gas regulation, transportation refrigeration unit regulation, and associated funding opportunities. Air District and California Air Resources Board staff will be available to provide one-on-one assistance with truck owners on compliance and funding questions.
