Bay Area Bike Share ridership data now available online

SAN FRANCISCO – Ridership data from the Bay Area Bike Share pilot program is now available online at www.bayareabikeshare.com/system-data. The system-wide data is updated monthly and includes information about the total number of trips taken, annual members and casual members using the system.

The website features graphs that show the cumulative data of the pilot program on a daily and monthly basis. The data is also broken down geographically with information available for each of the five cities where the Bike Share pilot program operates.

With more than 100,000 trips made in its first four months of operation, the regional Bike Share pilot program continues to grow with more riders and members joining every day. An expansion of the pilot program will take place in 2014, increasing the number of bicycle stations to 100 among the five cities and bringing the total number of bikes within the system to 1,000.
