Annual youth conference encourages action for clean air

Free Youth for Environment and Sustainability Conference to be held February 24 in Oakland

SAN FRANCISCO — The annual Youth for Environment and Sustainability, or YES, Conference, returns to the Bay Area from 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. on Saturday, February 24, 2018, at Laney College, 900 Fallon Street in Oakland.

The free day-long regional conference will bring together middle and high school students from the nine San Francisco Bay Area counties to discuss topics ranging from climate change and public health to transportation and air pollution. The Bay Area Air Quality Management District and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission co-sponsor the annual conference.

“Now more than ever, it’s important that our next generation of leaders is well-informed about the public health and climate challenges we face,” said Jack Broadbent, executive officer of the Air District. “The YES Conference provides an opportunity for Bay Area teens to present innovative ideas and develop solutions to our most pressing challenges in the region and beyond.”

“The YES Conference has always been a fun way for our future leaders to think about new ways to solve problems,” said MTC Executive Director Steve Heminger. “We’re happy to continue the tradition and to get another fresh jolt of teenage energy.”

At the YES Conference, hundreds of Bay Area students come together to discuss better ways to get to school or work and participate in leadership workshops put on by other teens. Students learn about paid internships, the latest climate science and technologies, enjoy photo booths, bike blenders, bike repair workshops, art, music, and win fun prizes.

The goal is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and driving by increasing walking and biking as a transportation mode among youths and their families thereby improving air quality in their communities throughout the San Francisco Bay Area.
