A Consent Decree entered against Equilon Enterprises LLC (hereinafter "Shell") by the US District Court for the Southern District of Texas on March 21, 2001 requires that Shell complete a program to reduce overall NOx emissions from heaters and boilers at certain refineries it owns and operates within the U.S. In order to obtain credit for projects that result in NOx reductions, the Consent Decree requires Shell to apply for and receive enforceable permit limits from the local permitting authority. The Bay Area Air Quality Management District (District) is the local permitting authority for the Shell Martinez Refinery that is affected by the Consent Decree. The purpose of the revision is to incorporate into Shell Martinez Refinery's MFR permit enforceable permit limits in the form of permit conditions for two combustion units (sources S-1510 and S-1511) that were retrofitted with ultra low NOx burners in November 2005. In light of the above and consistent with the Consent Decree, the District has decided to issue the permit to the Shell Martinez Refinery incorporating permit conditions 23559 and 23560 to limit the NOx emissions from sources S-1510 and S-1511, respectively.
