

Thu, It is very confusing for the uninitiated to view and understand the Statement of Basis but it is the key. It can only be found by going to Title V Permits and finding Lehigh and then scrolling down and eventually there it is. However if you click on it you get nothing. If you then click around and accidentally click on Engineering guess what comes up. It is Statement of Basis. However it is the redlined version showing changes to the prior Statement of Basis. If you search on Lehigh Statement of Basis you get a compendium of documents but not the document of record from the Public Notice. It appears buried.

Certainly many of us are interested in the changes from the existing Title V Permit and the Proposed Title V Permit of 2009 but the majority of the Public will go to the Statement of Basis with disinterest in the conflicted history of this one. The Statement of Basis should be prominently shown and labeled as Statement of Basis and not buried under Engineering or shown only in redlined versions.
