

Overview of Relevant Permitting Rules



Regulation 2, Rule 1: General Requirements (Rule 2-1)

- Procedure for the review of modified and new sources of air pollution
- Issuance of authorities to construct and permits to operate

Regulation 2, Rule 5: New Source Review of Toxic Air Contaminants (Rule 2-5)

- Review of new and modified sources of toxic air contaminant emissions
- **Evaluate** potential public exposure and health risk
- Mitigate potentially significant health risks resulting from these exposures
- Provide net health risk benefits by improving the level of control when existing sources are modified or replaced

Rule 2-1: General Requirements





Provide more information to the public on active permit applications in communities that face environmental and health burdens

DEFINITIONS

Overburdened Community: census tract >70th percentile CalEnviroScreen Version 4.0 or within 1,000 feet of any such tract Section 2-1-243

ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

Extend Permit Application review from 35 days to 45 days


Further consideration: limit extended review to the most complex applications





72 → 66 → 138



Rule 2-5: Toxic New Source Review





Reduce exposure to toxic air contaminant emissions by increasing the level of stringency for new or modified equipment subject to air toxics new source review




Rule 2-5: Potentially Impacted Projects

Percentage of Cancer Risk Assessments by Project Type


Projects with Cancer Risk of 6-10 in One Million in Overburdened Communities


