On **Wednesday, June 2, 2021**, the Board of Directors of the Air District will conduct a public hearing at the Air District Headquarters' Board Room, 375 Beale Street, San Francisco, California, at 9:00 a.m.

The Board will consider:

• Adoption of the proposed amendments to Regulation 6, Rule 5: Particulate Emissions from Refinery Fluidized Catalytic Cracking Units.

The Air District is proposing amendments to Regulation 6, Rule 5: Particulate Emissions from Refinery Fluidized Catalytic Cracking Units (Rule 6-5). Fluidized catalytic cracking units (FCCUs) are the largest single source of particulate matter emissions at petroleum refineries, and further reductions of particulate matter emissions are needed to ensure attainment and maintenance of state and national ambient air quality standards and to provide clean air and public health benefits. These sources were also identified in the Air District's 2018 Expedited Best Available Retrofit Control Technology (BARCT) Implementation Schedule, which was developed pursuant to California Assembly Bill (AB) 617. The schedule included a number of potential rule development efforts to reduce emissions at industrial sources subject to the State Cap-and-Trade rule, including potential amendments to Rule 6-5.

The proposed amendments to Rule 6-5 include new and modified limits on ammonia and sulfur dioxide. The proposed amendments also include a direct limit on total particulate matter less than 10 microns in diameter (total PM₁₀), which includes both filterable and condensable particulate matter. The proposed amendments would also clarify existing rule provisions and improve monitoring requirements.

The Air District certified an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) in 2018 pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act that addresses impacts from the proposed amendments to Rule 6-5 in conjunction with the AB 617 Expedited BARCT Implementation Schedule (State Clearing House Number: 2018082003). If the Air District Board of Directors adopts the proposed amendments the Board will make a finding that the previous EIR remains applicable and will issue a Statement of Overriding Considerations.
