3. Recap of Previous Meeting

a. Summary

- i. Co-Chair Nina gave a recap of the CSC #21 meeting.
 - 1. Last month, the CSC held a moment of silence for Karen Pierce (BVHPCA).
 - 2. The CSC also reviewed the focus area descriptions, problem statements and developed strategies and actions for PM, Dust, and Construction Impacts and Monitoring and Data Focus Areas in small groups.

4. Vote to Remove CSC Member

a. Summary:

- i. Co-Chair Chalam Tubati shared that there have been multiple instances of Tacora Hollins allegedly acting in violation of the CSC charter and Group Meeting Agreements. Co-Chair Chalam presented a motion on behalf of both Co-Chairs to remove Tacora from the CSC.
 - 1. Uzuri seconded the motion.
- ii. The CSC proceeded to vote by ballot. Co-Chair Nina explained that all CSC members' votes would be anonymous.
 - 1. Kimberly (CSC) asked why their names were on the ballot?
 - a. Uzuri (CSC) answered that the names on the ballots were for CSC Co-Chairs to know who voted and make sure each CSC member only voted once.
 - b. Uzuri (CSC) asked for a neutral third party to check ballots so there would not be any discrepancy.
 - c. Co-Chair Nina assured Uzuri (CSC) that ballots would be collected by Co-Chair Chalam and counted publicly and anonymously.
 - d. Co-Chair Chalam collected all CSC members' ballots.
 - a. Co-Chair Nina read out loud the vote on each ballot (but not the CSC member name).
 - b. Co-Chair Chalam marked each "Yes", "No", and "Abstain" on the board.
 - e. Co-Chair Chalam read the total Vote Counts (see below) and stated the yes's have it. The motion carried.
 - i. Yes: 12
 - ii. No: 2
 - iii. Abstain: 2
- iii. Co-Chair Nina announced a 5-minute break.

6. Strategy Development Activity

a. Summary

- i. Anna (Air District) reconvened the CSC and went over the Strategy Development Activity instructions. She reminded CSC members that this activity was similar to last month's. She explained that the activity would be focused on two focus areas: Community Health Impacts and PDR and Land Use and that CSC members would engage with both focus areas. Each table will develop draft strategies and actions and be supported by Air District Table Leads, CARB staff, and Technical Advisory Group members. The purpose of the exercise was to propose edits to the focus area descriptions and problem statements, as well as brainstorm strategies and actions.
- ii. Co-Chair Chalam shared that there is a map for land use and the planning department is here to help explain it.
 1. Jeremy Shaw from SF Planning explained the color coding on the map and how to use the legend.
 2. Co-Chair Chalam mentioned that everyone had the handout with the map and could use it to draft strategies and actions.
 3. Jeremy (SF Planning) also explained that PDR 1G is generally for light industry and research labs. PDR 2 is intense, usually for heavy industry and is only allowed after a strong review process, often completely prohibited, but if allowed, are only allowed in PDR 2.
 4. Uzuri (CSC) asked if the community was surrounded by blue (PDR area according to the zoning map legend)?
 - a. Jeremy (SF Planning) answered that that was correct.
 5. Anna (Air District) encouraged everyone to come up to the big map and ask clarifying questions to the leads at their table.
 6. Sofia (CSC) said she didn't have the chance to look at the Google Drive and asked if all the data that's been accumulated during CSC meetings can be seen by members.
 - a. Wendy Goodfriend (Air District) mentioned that an email went out with links to an online map with emission sources and an updated inventory and modeling report that will be a part of the plan. If members cannot find that email, they should let Air District staff know and it will be re-sent to them.
- iii. CSC members engaged in the activity for about 90 minutes and then participated in a report out where one member from the four groups shared one strategy or action.
 1. Table 1: Amelia (CSC) shared an action around taking empty warehouses in the PDR and transforming them into a new greenway (e.g., Vis Valley Greenway) near Bayview Hill Park.

2. Table 2: Nina (Co-Chair) discussed how the transportation of goods and services in the area does not align with how little goods and services are available. She also mentioned how bad public transportation is right now. She suggested linking the Bayview Shuttle to Muni, fixing roads, and getting sidewalks fixed, and providing goods and services to improve community health.
3. Table 3: Uzuri (CSC) shared learning about how grandfathering is when a pre-existing land use does not meet new zoning roles, but they can still operate in that area. She also emphasized holding the city and county accountable when developing zoning laws.
4. Table 4: Amanpreet (CSC) discussed the importance of Including Key Performance Indicators in the problem statements. She mentioned how statements such as “It doesn’t ‘feel safe” are not enough because it is more than that. And the problem statements need to be inclusive of the outdoor environment being toxic. Indoor and outdoor air quality need to be worked on, along with access to green spaces (ex. Bret Hart Elementary)
