Sharing Our Progress: Update on Community Air Monitoring Plan

Assembly Bill 617

- Originated in negotiations regarding the extension of Cap & Trade program (AB 398)
- Responds to advocates' concerns with continued high levels of air pollution in local communities
- Directly addresses toxics and criteria pollutants in the most impacted communities
- Initial communities serve as statewide models



AB 617 Community-Driven Programs

Air Monitoring Plan

- Better understand sources contributing to disparate air quality impacts
- Initial monitoring required to start on July 1, 2019
- No formal requirement for plan submittal timing or approval

Emissions Reduction Plan


- Identify, prioritize, and implement emission and exposure reduction measures
- Must develop and submit emission reduction plan to California Air Resources Board (CARB) one year after the community is selected by CARB

Why was Richmond-San Pablo chosen for a monitoring plan?

- High emissions from many types of sources
- High health and socio-economic inequities
- New data can inform emissions reduction plan



How do air pollutants impact health?



Who is most impacted by poor air quality?









What are the potential impacts of poor air quality?

- Impaired lung growth in children
- Increased asthma, coughs and bronchitis
- Impairment of brain development in babies and young children
- Low birth weight and adverse birth outcomes
- Heart attack and stroke
- Upper respiratory tract irritation and infection
- Worsening of existing health problems in people with chronic disease



How can community air monitoring help?

Identify "hotspots" - areas with elevated levels of pollutants

Understand what sources contribute to "hotspots" of air pollution

Provide information to develop strategies to reduce emissions and exposure

Provide easy to understand and accessible data to community members



AB 617 Community Air Monitoring Guiding Principles






What does the community-led process entail?

Community shaped process, including Steering Committee membership and decision-making.




DESIGNED BY COMMUNITY

June 2019, the Committee selected mobile monitoring and sensor network projects to:


- Identify areas with elevated levels of air pollution

- Provide real-time data to the public

Data from mobile monitoring available this winter.


How will we select additional monitoring projects?






