



Reviewing Year 1 Priority Actions - Inform

Action

C&I 4.4: West Contra Costa County Landfill

- Implement Rule 11-18 for the landfill
- Track success of C&I actions in addressing dust issues, compliance, and other community concerns

Update

- Air District Legal staff discussed the landfill in May 2025 as part of the Annual report out (FR 3.7).
- The Air District is working on Rule 11-18 implementation - facility updates will be shared via Rule 11-18 CSC Liaisons as they become available (FR 4.4).

FR 3.5: Expedite Fuel Refining NOVs

- Air District will resolve all outstanding Notices of Violation (NOVs)
- Continue to prioritize Chevron when resolving backlog

- The 2024 Rule 6-5 settlement agreement resolved the backlog of NOVs for Chevron, achieving the initial intent. This is now in a state of maintenance (Ongoing).
- The CSC receives Quarterly and Annual Updates about penalties assessed (FR 3.7) and has a PTCA liaison participating on the Legal Enforcement Working Group (advancing FR 3.8).

Rule amendments; Track success of C&I actions in addressing compliance and other community concerns

Update

- The Air District is facilitating discussions with the City of Richmond and the County. CSC Member BK White is participating and CSC Leads are being kept informed.
- The Air District is now offering offering email and text alerts for incident response. The Air District is currently working on creating and establishing standardized protocols for incident responses.
- Flaring was the focus of the April 2025 CSC meeting. Discussion covered how the CSC would like to be involved in flaring action implementation.
- The RTWG is working on Flaring 101 materials.
- During Plan writing, staff met with CSC members working on C&I actions to discuss the draft white paper. Paper was later published.
- As the rule development process progresses and public engagement opportunities arise, updates will be provided to the CSC via email.
- A white paper was released in July 2024. The CSC received email updates about the metal recycling white paper (2024) and draft rule workshops (2025) and the associated public comment opportunities.

Air District will collaboratively develop and pilot legal enforcement approaches for fuel refining facilities. Then expand to cover all PTCA sources.

FR 2.6: Flaring Rule Amendments
Rules 12-11 and Rule 12-12

Update

- Rule Dev: The CSC was notified about draft amendments to Reg 5 and Rule 6-3 - including workshops and the associated public comment opportunity. CSC was also notified about the amendments going to the Board in October, and it's ultimate adoption.
- Incentives: The Clean HEET program was launched to fund replacement of wood-burning devices. Regular EJ updates were provided on the program. Two fireplace replacements have been funded in the PTCA area so far, as noted in the Annual Report.
- The Air District is developing a new Enforcement Policy as part of implementing the Strategic Plan. PTCA has a liaison participating in the Legal Enforcement Working Group.
- The Air District initiated the Refinery Technical Working Group (RTWG). Two CSC Liaisons from the PTCA CSC are participating as members of the RTWG. Regular liaison report outs to the full CSC are occurring.

R 1.2: Annual Implementation Plan

Update

- The CSC selected Year 1 Action priorities in late 2024 and early 2025. The PTCA Year 1 Implementation Plan was finalized in October 2024.
- Annual reporting will occur on a recurring basis in October starting in 2025.
- Implementation Planning is ongoing as well, in close collaboration with the CSC

M&R 4.1: Regulate Emissions
Reductions from Cargo Handling
Equipment (CHE)

 CARB is beginning the rulemaking process for amendments to the Cargo Handling Equipment (CHE) rule. No formal documents or outreach has occurred yet. CARB is participating in site visits with CHE experts to begin the rulemaking process. The Air District is tracking CARB's CHE amendments process. The CSC will be informed of any updates as they occur.

Update

- In 2024, the CSC identified liaisons to support CSC involvement regarding Rule 11-18. In 2025, Rule 11-18 and risk reduction were a top priority for CSC meeting agendas.
- Following in depth discussions in Jan/Feb 2025, Engagement Recommendations were developed to support CSC engagement objectives.
- Draft rule amendments for Rule 11-18 were published in Aug 2025.
 PTCA liaisons are working with staff to ensure PTCA interests are represented in the Rule 11-18 amendment process.
- The Air District secured a decisive victory with respect to the litigation with Chevron. FR 5.1 is now in progress via the finalized <u>Rule 6-5 Settlement Agreement</u>.
- The settlement agreement covers rule implementation, penalties and penalty funds, and flaring measures.
- The CSC was engaged via presentations on penalty funds, as well as flaring measures, at several CSC meetings during 2024 and 2025.
- Staff will keep the CSC informed of any progress updates as they become available

Update

- In Spring 2025, a Just Transition Standing Committee (JTSC) was convened. The CSC formed the JTSC and approved a Plan of Action in accordance with the Year 1 Implementation Plan.
- In July 2025, the JTSC hosted a successful educational workshop. At the workshop, a list of Just Transition Principles drafted by the JTSC was discussed in order to collect feedback from the community.
- In May 2024, the Air District Board of Directors approved a policy to allocate money to a community benefits fund via an 80% local to 20% regionwide split.
- The Community Benefits Standing Committee (CBSC) was created at the March 2025 PTCA CSC Meeting. On May 19, 2025, the CBSC Plan of Action was approved by the CSC. The CBSC has met 6 times.
- The June 2025 CSC meeting included a presentation on the Air District's Community Investments Office, including a timeline of funding community benefits from penalty funds.

 - For rule amendments
