



West Oakland Current Enforcement Issues





- Homelessness, garbage, and safety issues throughout, esp. concentrated on the perimeter (near freeways) and the major thoroughfares.
 - Fires of illegally dumped materials create air quality/health risks for housed and unhoused residents.
 - Lots of debris from illegal dumping along the railroads -especially at the city boarders
- The **freeway underpasses** blight, encampments, safety concerns, noise hazards, odors, mobility issues, and traffic speed.
 - Esp in residential Hoover neighborhood bordering the 980 Freeway, along with Prescott, Oak Center, and the Lower Bottoms.
- The Waste Treatment plant ⇒ negative quality of life and health impacts in the neighborhood ⇒ need to be mitigated.
- Odors from the metal recyclers impact residents' health and quality of life
- Assess safety of railroad at-grade crossings
- Noise in West Oakland disrupts their sleep and overall health.
 - Residents can hear noise from rail yards at night there is no quiet zone policy for Amtrak or rail freight. Add policy to work with rail and the Port re noise mitigation.
 - There are food facilities (27th Street) near residential neighborhoods and they have daily trash pick up at 4am every morning.
- Need enforcement of sideshows and racing esp in: Hoover Foster, Army Base, Frontage Road, West Grand, Maritime, and MLK.
- Need **enforcement of illegal fireworks**. All summer the noise, odor, and litter from them is a big quality of life issue.



Step 1: Public Intake Form Complaint Category

•The Public Intake Form contains the following Complaint Categories:



- Only one complaint category can be selected at Step 1.
- The Complaint Category determines what fields are depicted on the Complaint Details page (in Step 2)
- The Complaint Category ultimately determines which Complaint Assignment Groups are assigned.
 - Air Air Resources Board
 - Pesticides Department of Pesticide Regulation.
 - Solid Waste CalRecycle
 - Water and Toxics

 based on what the public user selects on the Complaint Details page (Step 2)

Step 2: Public Intake Form *Complaint Details - Complaint Location*

The COMPLAINT LOCATION field:


- Textbox auto-suggests addresses as you type.
- Selected address gets pinned on map.
 You can also drag and drop pin on desired location.
- If there is no address to "pinpoint," complete the LOCATION DESCRIPTION field.
- Public user must complete either the <u>COMPLAINT LOCATION</u> field OR the <u>LOCATION DESCRIPTION</u> field.

Tip: When you do not know the address of the location, enter an address near the location and then drag the push pin to the correct location.



The "Complaint Location" field is very important!

Step 2: Complaint Location and EJ Complaints **Via workflow** (automated steps)

Location + CalEnviro Screen

• Geocoded location (lat and long) is submitted to CalEnviroScren 4.0

Census Tract Look Up CalEnviroScreen service determines Census Tract for Lat and Long.

CalEnviro Screen Percentile OEHHA calculates and assigns each Census Tract the CalEnviroScreen Score and Percentile Ranking

Document Score The workflow stores the CalEnviroScreen Score and Percentile Ranking in the Complaint record.

EJ Check

• When the CalEnviroScreen Percentile Ranking is ≥75, the Complaint is marked as an Environmental Justice (EJ) complaint.

West Oakland Community Action Plan Adopted

Plan estimates that by 2024, port trucks regs will have a decrease in DPM. Forecasted as a drop of approximately 0.4 tons/year of DPM relative to base year of 2017.



Take away: the significant decrease in potential cancer risk from drayage trucks is due to CARB regulations forcing the turnover of the drayage truck fleet to low emission engines.

Marine Terminal Operator Appointment System (Oakland Seaport)

- Marine terminal operators at the Oakland Seaport implement an appointment system for container pick-ups and drop-offs.
- An appointment allows a port trucker to arrive at the marine terminal within the scheduled time for the container transaction.
- The implementation of the appointment system at each marine terminal operator complies with the BAAQMD 30-minute idling limit.


June 28-29, 2023

CARB inspected 84 trucks and issued 24 citations.

- **Day 1**: Three inspection sites on Adeline and 3rd St.
- Day 2: One team remained on Adeline/3rd St and two set up by Maritime St and Burma Rd.



June 2023 - West Oakland Field Event Summary


CARB conducted a two-day enforcement field event in West Oakland on June 28-29, 2023. Prior to the field event, staff met with the West Oakland Environmental Indicators Project (WOEIP) to discuss our plan of action and to identify potential locations within the community to conduct roadside inspections. Staff also coordinated with the California Highway Patrol (CHP) to identify locations to safely set up inspection sites and pull over diesel trucks for inspection.

On the first day, staff set up three inspection sites at Adeline and 3rd Street, an intersection that the community had noted has high truck activity. We were unable to set up the Portable Emissions Acquisition System (PEAQS) device due to technical difficulties and as such, the enforcement team focused on roadside inspections for both days. On the second day, staff set up two inspection sites by the intersection of Maritime Street and Burma Road, another location identified by the community as an area of high truck activity. One team (Team A) remained at the Adeline Street inspection site. In total, CARB inspected 84 trucks and issued 24 citations across various enforcement programs. The breakdown of inspections and citations are included in Table 1 below. The citations are also described below.

What happens next?

When CARB issues a citation to a vehicle in the field, our citations unit identifies the proper owner and sends them a citation notice letter. This letter includes instructions on how to clear the citation and the due date for submitting proof of correction. The timeline for submitting their proof of correction varies depending on the citation – it is typically 30 days, but can be longer (e.g., 45 days for the heavy-duty inspection and maintenance program). They are also required to pay a monetary penalty, which also varies depending on the enforcement program. Examples of proof of compliance include:

- A copy of the invoice from the engine dealer that clearly shows that a new label has been installed on the cited vehicle if the citation is regarding the Emissions Control Label,
- A passing opacity test or a passing OBD test for an Excessive Smoke citation,
- Documentation showing transfer of vehicle ownership if the vehicle has been sold,
- Documentation showing that the vehicle is non-operational if it has been junked, or
- A copy of a valid repair order showing which parts were replaced to correct the violation for tampering.

If the truck owner does not provide proof of compliance, they may be subject to additional enforcement actions such as denials on registration renewals or court action. CARB offers the Diesel hotline, (866) 6-DIESEL or (866) 634-3735, which truck owners can call to talk to one of our experts about compliance options. Alternatively, truck owners can send an email to citations@arb.ca.gov.


BAAQMD Notice of Violation (NOV) Query Tool - Ying Yu - BAAQMD

FITS Overview

FITS Purpose:

- Improve efficiency, circulation, safety, incident response, and operations.
- Reduce congestion, queues, and idling times.
- Manage traffic throughout the Port during operations and construction.
- Inform users with real time data for decision making ahead of time.
- Improve circulation and reliability of truck and rail access throughout the seaport.





FITS Cost and Schedule

- FITS is fully funded through a combination of local, state and federal monies (approx. \$40 million).
- Construction is complete and currently in systems integration phase.
- Expected to be operational in October/November 2023.
