AIR QUALITY ISSUES

Ozone (O₃)

- Regional
- Respiratory system impacts; Aggravates asthma & emphysema

Toxic Air Contaminants (TACs)

- Local
- Cancer risk; Respiratory system impacts

• Fine Particulate Matter (PM2.5)


- Local and regional
- Higher instances of asthma; Elevated mortality rates

Green House Gases (GHG)

- Problem is global; solutions can have local/regional co-benefits
- Changing climate leads to more high heat days, more wildfires




OZONE EXCEEDANCE TRENDS 1968 TO PRESENT






AIR TOXICS TRENDS 1990 - 2001 - 2012

Expect this year


Drought conditions increasing wildfire potential

Multi-pollutant control strategy is the backbone of program to reduce PM, Ozone, TACs & GHGs

Technical analyses

Stationary Sources

- Regulations & permit conditions
- Wood-burning rule & Winter Spare The Air program
- New control measures in 2014/15 Clean
 Air Plan

Mobile Sources

- ARB regulations reduce emissions from heavy- & light-duty vehicles & equipment

FINANCIAL SUMMARY TOPIC FOR FYE 2015 BUDGET

- Healthy reserves, but....
- Unfunded Liabilities
- Cost Recovery Rate Exaggerated by Vacancy Rate
- No use of Reserves in FYE 2013, 2014
- No use of Reserves anticipated in FYE 2015



PERSONNEL COSTS

	Number (#)	Percentage (%)
FTE Filled	311	85%
Vacancies	54	15%
Total FTE	365	100%



PURCHASE OF 375 BEALE STREET

- Air District entered into Lease/Purchase Agreement with BAHA for approximately 63,000 square feet at \$385/sq ft.
- Air District Financing completed November 2013
- Purchase Occurs upon Move-In
- MTC, the Air District and potentially ABAG will cohabit under terms of a Condominium Agreement



YEARLY COSTS

- Annual cost projections still within original range:
 - Current Projection: \$2.4 M \$2.6 M
- Slightly larger size (75,000 sq. ft.) offset by lower interest rates

Inter Agency Shared Services Delivery Assessment

- Work to develop options for sharing various business operations and shared technology services are underway
- Agencies have engaged Accenture
- Administrative management staff from each of the agencies also developed recommendations for sharing resources to deliver other services including receptionist, meeting room management, mail, copy center and other general services.



FURNITURE PROCUREMENT RFP PROCESS

- RFP process to select a Manufacturer/Dealer Team
 - Must have previous experience on substantially similar projects 550 workstations/offices and 50+ conference rooms
 - Furniture committee comprised of representatives from each agency established
 - Project Budget: \$5.0 million

MY AIR ONLINE PROGRAM STATUS

- Gas Station Permitting & Inspection (Released Mar 2012)
 - 228 Permit Applications Approved
 - 3818 Permits Renewed
 - 1378 Inspection Tasks
- Dry Cleaner Permitting & Inspection (Release Nov 2012)
 - 21 Permit & Registration Applications Approved
 - 423 Permits & Registrations Renewed
 - 133 Inspection Tasks
- Auto Body Coating Operations (2014)
 - 1109 permitted facilities (will be cutover in coordination with Engineering/Enforcement)
- Online Payment for Asbestos Renovation & Demolition (Released May 2013)
- Online Payment for Open Burn (Released September 2013)
- Querying and Reporting for all permitted and registered facilities
- Completed discovery and assessment phase of the website redesign project

OVERVIEW OF KEY POLICY INITIATIVES

- SB 1339 Commuter Benefits Program
- Climate Action Work Program
- Petroleum Refinery Emissions Tracking Rule



BAY AREA COMMUTER BENEFITS PROGRAM

- New Program in response to Senate Bill 1339
- Collaboration between Air District & MTC
- Reduce emissions by expanding # of employers who promote alternative commute modes
- Employers choose from among 4 simple options
- Would apply to employers w 50+ full-time employees in Bay Area
- Provides tax savings to employers & employees
- Proposed Regulation 14-1 to Board for hearing in March

Petroleum Refinery Emissions Tracking Rule

- New rule would address potential increases in emissions from changing crude oil slates (e.g., use of tar sands) or other factors
- Approach:
 - Track air emissions and community air quality over time
 - If annual emissions from a refinery increase by more than a small amount:
 - 1. Require that the cause be analyzed and disclosed
 - 2. Require that an emission reduction audit be completed and feasible measures be taken to reduce emissions expeditiously
- Rule Development Schedule:
 - Workshops held in April 2013
 - Discussions with stakeholders continue with Technical Work Group
 - Consideration of adoption expected in summer 2014
