CMP & MSIF

Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

- > Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
- ➤ Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)

- ➤ AB 923 allowed for additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
- CMP and LESBP projects eligible for MSIF funding



CMP Year 16

On 2/19/14 District Board of Directors:

- > Approved participation in CMP Year 16
- ➤ Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000


CMP Project Recommendations over \$100k

- ➤ 8 Projects to reduce emissions from: 4 tractors, 6 loaders, and 4 marine engines
- > \$1,174,793 in total awards
- Emission reductions: Over 5.7 TPY of criteria pollutants




CMP/ MSIF and VIP Funds

- Member based system for short-term use
- Ideal for first and last-mile connection
- Self-serve automated stations
- Customer call center support
- Operates 24/7








System Results Trips by Community Area

Aug. 29, 2013 to Aug. 31, 2014






Next Steps Data Analysis and Planning for System Expansion

- Avoided vehicle miles traveled (from mode shift)
- Greenhouse gas and criteria pollution reductions
- Member travel mode behavior (transit relationships and travel mode shift)
- Operating costs by trip and by jurisdiction
- TFCA and overall cost-effectiveness
- Options for system financial self-sustainability
- Coordination with MTC and new communities on local planning requirements



TFCA Background

- To reduce on-road mobile source emissions (est. 1991)
 - Governed by California Health and Safety Code (HSC)
- \$4 motor vehicle registration surcharge fee:
 - 40% of funds distributed to the 9 Bay Area Congestion Management Agencies (County Program Manager Fund)
 - 60% awarded directly by the Air District through the Regional Fund program and to Air District sponsored projects (e.g., Spare the Air)
- Each year, Air District Board approves TFCA policies



Summary of Revisions FYE 2016 Policies

- Minor updates to improve clarity and adherence to HSC
- Revise the shuttle project policy to align with Board-adopted FYE
 2015 TFCA Regional Fund Policies
- Add policy language related to bicycle facility projects to allow new project category ("cycle tracks")
- Revise the policy relating to bike share projects to allow funds to be used for up to 5 years of operations
- Streamline vehicle weight categories for alternative vehicle and infrastructure policies



Process for Generating FYE 2016 Policies

- 8/29 9/26/14 Solicited comments from County Program Managers on proposed policies
- 9/12/14 Teleconference with County Program Manager representatives to discuss proposed revisions
- By 9/26/14 Written comments received (Attachment C)
- Incorporated comments and aligned County Program Manager Fund Policies with Board-adopted Regional Fund Policies for consistency, clarity, and best practices

Background

- To reduce on-road mobile source emissions (est. 1991)
 - Governed by California Health and Safety Code (HSC)
- \$4 motor vehicle registration surcharge fee:

 Management Agencies (County Program Manager Fund)
- Each year the Air District's Board of Directors adopts policies and evaluation criteria for TFCA



Background FYE 2015 Cycle

- Air District's Board of Directors:
 - > Allocated up to \$4 million for FYE 2015 Projects, 5/21/14
 - > Adopted policies and evaluation criteria, 6/4/14
- Call for Projects: 6/21/14 8/11/14
- Grant application workshops held in San Francisco and via online webinar, 7/2/14 & 7/14/14
- 14 Applications Received (12 Shuttle, 2 Ridesharing) as of 10/6/14



FYE 2015 Policies and Evaluation Criteria

Shuttle/feeder bus projects:

- Provide direct connection between mass transit hub and distinct commercial or employment area
- ➤ May not replace or duplicate existing local transit service; However, projects funded in FYE 2014 exempt from this requirement (until December 31, 2016)
- > TFCA funds only pay for commuter peak-hour service

Ridesharing projects:

- > Comprised of riders from a minimum of 5 Bay Area counties
- > No single county may account for more than 80% of riders



Recommended Change to Policy #2

- Staff proposes an increase in the cost-effectiveness limit (Policy #2) to \$175,000/ton for:
 - Existing Shuttle Projects
 - Year 2 Pilot Shuttle Projects
 - > Year 3 Pilot Shuttle Projects in CARE areas and PDAs.
- Change is recommended for the following reasons:
 - > Adjust for CARB's revisions to emission factors
 - Minimize impact to existing projects while the program is undergoing review



Evaluation Results

9 projects (2 rideshare and 7 shuttle) recommended for award (at \$175k C/E limit):

- 8 projects eligible for full award amount (\$2,704,978)
 - > 2 ridesharing projects (\$1,140,000)
 - > 6 shuttle projects = 35 shuttle routes (\$1,564,978)
- 1 shuttle project eligible for reduced award amount (\$992,528) = 21 routes at full and 3 routes at partial award amounts
- 68% of funds to CARE areas and/or PDAs (\$2,532,234)
- Estimated reductions:
 - > 87 tons of criteria pollutants, and
 - \rightarrow 47,810 tons of CO₂





Recommendations

Request the Committee recommend the Board of Directors:

- 1. Approve a change to FYE 2015 TFCA Regional Fund Policy #2 to increase the cost-effectiveness limit to \$175,000/ton of emissions reduced for existing shuttle projects, year 2 pilot shuttle projects, and year 3 pilot shuttle projects in CARE areas or PDAs;
- 2. Approve proposed awards for the TFCA Shuttle and Ridesharing projects listed in Attachment A at the revised cost-effectiveness limit of \$175,000/ton of emissions reduced; and
- 3. Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to enter into agreements for the recommended TFCA projects in Attachment A.
