# CMP, MSIF, & TFCA

## Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

- > Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
- ➤ Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

### Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)

- ➤ AB 923 allowed for additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
- CMP and LESBP projects eligible for MSIF funding

## Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)

- Funding provided by a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicles
- Statutory authority for the TFCA and requirements of the program are set forth in California Health and Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242



## **CMP Year 16**

#### On 2/19/14 District Board of Directors:

- > Approved participation in CMP Year 16
- ➤ Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000


## CMP Project Recommendations over \$100k

- ➤ 2 Projects to reduce emissions from 4 marine engines
- > \$376,900 in total awards
- Emission reductions: Over 2.8 TPY of criteria pollutants




## **CMP/MSIF** and VIP Funds

## **TFCA FYE 2015**

#### On 5/21/14 District Board of Directors:

- ➤ Allocated \$18.8 million in TFCA funding for eligible Air Districtled and Regional Fund project categories
- Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000

#### On 6/4/14 District Board of Directors:

Adopted policies and evaluation criteria for the FYE 2015 TFCA Regional Fund program

## TFCA Project Recommendations over \$100k

- ➤ 1 Project to install 112 electronic bicycle lockers in BART stations
- > Recommended award amount is \$280,000
- Emission reductions: Over 0.29 TPY of criteria pollutants

Figure 1: Funding Distributed by Project Category





Figure 2: Funding Distributed by County

## **Funding Sources**

## Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

- > Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
- > Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

### Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)

- ➤ AB 923 allowed \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
- > CMP projects eligible for MSIF funding

In 2013, AB 8 reauthorized CMP & MSIF funding to 2024



## **Year 17 Funding**

- ARB allocation
  - > \$58.9 million statewide
  - ➤ Up to \$10.6 million for the Bay Area
  - > 5% allocation for administrative costs
  - ➤ Up to \$1.8 million in required match
- Proposed \$5 million MSIF allocation for matching funds and additional CMP projects



## **Year 17 Implementation**

- 2011 ARB CMP Guidelines
- Impacted Communities
  - ➤ Priority given to projects reducing emissions in highly impacted communities
  - ➤ At least 50% of funds for projects in most impacted areas
- Projects over \$100k brought to the Board for approval
- Schedule
  - > First-come, first served process
  - ➤ Call for project applications summer 2015
  - Funds must be obligated by June 2016, and invoices paid by June 2017



## Year 17 Multi-district funds

- ARB reserves up to 10% of CMP allocation for projects that reduce emissions in multiple air districts.
- In May 2013, CAPCOA and ARB agreed to alternate administration of funding between BAAQMD and SCAQMD for funding Years 15 through 18.
- BAAQMD to administer Year 15 and Year 17 funding.
- Resolution to accept up to CMP Year 17 multi-district funding.



## Recommendations

#### Recommend the Board of Directors:

- 1. Adopt a resolution authorizing the Executive Officer/APCO to execute all necessary agreements with the California Air Resources Board (ARB) relating to the Air District's receipt of Carl Moyer Program (CMP) funds and Multi-District funds for fiscal year 2014-2015 (Program Year 17).
- 2. Allocate \$5 million in Mobile Source Incentive Funding to provide the required match funding and additional monies for projects eligible for funding under the Carl Moyer Program.

#### • District Financial Audit

➤ Government agencies are required by law to conduct an independent audit of their annual financial statements

## Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)

➤ California Health and Safety Code Section 44242 requires an audit on each program or project funded with motor vehicle registration fee surcharges (TFCA)

#### Carbon Offset Fund

➤ MOU between the Attorney General of California and District allows District to audit any project funded by Carbon Offset Funds



## **Scope of Work**

## Project #1: Financial Audit

➤ Audit BAAQMD financial statements for FY 2014-15 (General Fund and Special Revenue Fund)

### Project #2: TFCA

➤ Conduct Financial Statement Audits of TFCA projects and programs closed in FY 2013-14

## Project #3: Carbon Offset Fund

Assist BAAQMD in obtaining evidence that Carbon Offset Fund projects were completed in accordance with funding agreement requirements (project review)



## **Auditor Selection Process**

## Process for Obtaining Proposals:

- > RFP issued and widely advertised 10/20/2014
- ➤ Pre-bidders conference held 10/30/2014 and 11/20/2014
- ➤ Responses to Public Comments/Questions posted by 11/21/2014
- Four proposals received by RFP submittal deadline 12/5/2014: Armanino LLP; Gilbert Associates, Inc.; James Marta & Co. LLP; and Macias, Gini and O'Connell LLP

## Evaluation of Proposals:

- > 4-person panel evaluated proposals based on RFP criteria
- ➤ Gilbert Associates earned highest overall score

#### Recommendations

### Recommend the Board of Directors:

- 1. Approve the selection of Gilbert Associates, Inc. to conduct the District's 2014-15 Financial Audit, the 2013-14 TFCA Audit for Projects and Programs, and conduct a review of Carbon Offset Project; and
- 2. Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to execute a contract with Gilbert & Associates, Inc. for audit services in an amount not to exceed \$217,022; and
- 3. Authorize the Executive Officer/APCO to extend the contract with Gilbert Associates Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$217,022 annually for up to an additional two years under the terms of the current RFP.


## **Background**

# Calendar Year 2014 - \$65 million allocated to reduce emissions from mobile sources:

- > Air District's primary grant programs:
  - Carl Moyer Program (CMP)
  - Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)
  - Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA)
  - California Goods Movement Bond (I-Bond)
- > \$9 million in TFCA funds to County Program Managers
- Federal grants for port trucks, and alternative fuels projects




# **2014 Allocations:** \$65 M






## **2014 Allocations by County**






# 2014 CMP Allocations Years 15 and 16: \$16 M

## **MSIF & GMP**

## • MSIF (\$14.7 M)

> VBB: \$4.9 M

➤ LESBP: \$9.8 M

## • GMP (\$12.9 M)

- > On-road trucks: \$12.9 M
- > Includes TFCA funds



## **Emissions Reductions**

- Emissions reduced by \$56 million in 2014 allocations:
  - ➤ Particulate Matter (PM) 99 tons per year
  - ➤ Nitrogen Oxides (NO<sub>x</sub>) 491 tons per year
  - ➤ Reactive Organic Gases (ROG) 216 tons per year
  - $\triangleright$  Carbon Dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>)\* 155,015 tons per year
- More than \$34 million allocated to projects in CARE areas

<sup>\*</sup>Not all programs report CO<sub>2</sub> reductions




## 2014 Highlights

- Continued emphasis on truck replacements
- Work w/ ARB and CAPCOA to draft legislative changes to CMP/MSIF statute
- Implementation of Bay Area PEV Readiness Plan:
  - > Incentives to accelerate deployment of vehicles and infrastructure
  - ➤ Outreach to workplaces, multi-family dwellings and local government
  - > Leverage Air District funds to attract state and federal funding
- Bike share 1 year anniversary:
  - ➤ More than 315,000 rides




## Total Allocations Since 2007 \$398M






# 2015 Revenue Projection: \$45 M
