



Monday's alert was the fifth in 2014 far as the Bay Area Air Quality Management District once again preares for unhealthy levels of smog round the region.

est, along with those who are active outdoors, by reducing lung function and damaging the lining of the lungs.

"To protect residents' heath, we recommend people avoid outdoor exercise during the hottest part of the day," Roselius said.

During the morning and afternoon commute, Roselius said, the smog isn't as bad, but once the heat hits stagnant vehicle exhaust, it starts settling around the area. The Livermore and Santa Clara valleys are expected to be hit the hardest.











How often do you bike to work?






Are there bike amenities at your work?
