Summary of Board of Directors Stationary Source Committee Meeting Monday, January 30, 2017

1. CALL TO ORDER – ROLL CALL

3. RULE DEVELOPMENT UPDATES (ITEM 4)

Mr. Broadbent, Executive Officer/Air Pollution Control Officer, briefly described how the three Draft Rules (12-16, 11-18, and 13-1) which are currently under development came about. Mr. Broadbent then introduced Greg Nudd, Rule Development Manager, who gave the staff presentation *Rule Development Updates*, including: overview; refinery rulemaking history - Board Resolution 2014-07, progress, and work on Draft Rule 12-16; Draft Rule 13-1 (first rule of combustion strategy), and how these rules compare; Draft Rule 11-18; schedule; and next steps.

Committee Comments Prior to Public Comments:

The Committee and staff discussed provision 38562.5 of AB 197, regarding the prioritization of regulations that result in direct emission reductions at large stationary sources of greenhouse gas emissions sources in disadvantaged communities, and how the California Air Resources Board (CARB) addresses regulatory measures outside of Cap and Trade in its revised Scoping Plan; the origins and intended purpose of Draft Rule 13-1, and whether or not it is complimentary with CARB's revised Scoping Plan and Low Carbon Fuel Standard, and how it could potentially impact the adoption schedule of Draft Rules 12-16 and 11-18; Staff's explanation of why it believes that the court would likely find Draft Rule 12-16 arbitrary and capricious, based on the limits of the District's authority and its selection of approaches for different industries; the types of facilities (cement kilns, chemical operations, power generation) that are likely to be affected by a future set

of regulations intended to follow Draft Rule 13-1; the six rules that the Board adopted since 2015, regarding refinery strategy goals; the reality that the State plans to move away from the reliance on fossil fuels in an effort to achieve a 40% reduction in greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2030; the need to balance the reduction of toxic and GHG emissions; how publicly owned treatment works facilities may be affected by District rules, and the parameters and economic indicators that are examined by the District when a new rule is being considered; the Board's acknowledgement of the fact that District meeting times can conflict with the schedules of those from the public who wish to give comments; assumptions that the District is aligned with the refinery industry at the expense of public health; the potential misconception that the Board has formed a consensus regarding how it plans to vote on the rules currently under development; the public's desire that the May 17, 2017, Board meeting be held in a refinery community at a time that would allow more members of the community to attend; and the hope that the California will exhibit tenacity regarding environmental initiatives and programs, despite a lack of federal support.

BACKGROUND

Since January 1, 2015, the Air District has received over 8,000 odor complaints from the solid waste handling and processing facilities in the region. Sewage treatment plants, waste transfer facilities, solid waste disposal landfills and other waste treatment facilities are sources of volatile organic compounds, toxics, greenhouse gasses and odors that impact neighborhoods, the region and the world. The solid waste industry is constantly changing to encourage recycling, reduce disposal of material in landfills and to reduce emissions.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

BACKGROUND

The Air District has released the draft 2017 Clean Air Plan: Spare the Air – Cool the Climate (draft Plan). The draft Plan responds to California Clean Air Act requirements to identify rules and strategies for the Air District to implement in order to meet state ambient air quality standards for ozone or "smog." With the draft Plan, the Air District is continuing the practice, established with its 2010 Clean Air Plan, of taking a multi-pollutant approach to regional clean air planning. The draft Plan includes measures and programs to reduce emissions of ozone precursors, particulate matter (PM) and toxic air contaminants (TACs), and includes a Regional Climate Protection Strategy, as directed in the Climate Protection Resolution adopted by the Board of Directors in November 2013.

DISCUSSION

Spare the Air – Cool the Climate focuses on two closely-related goals: 1) protecting public health by continuing to reduce air pollution emissions to eliminate disparities in exposure to air pollutants among Bay Area communities; and, 2) protecting the climate by laying the groundwork for a long-term effort to reduce Bay Area greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions 80 percent below the 1990 level by 2050, consistent with the State's and Air District's GHG reduction targets. The draft Plan includes a comprehensive, near-term (3-5 year) control strategy of 85 measures reflecting the entire suite of tools, expertise and resources at the disposal of the Air District and our partners to set the Bay Area on a path toward achieving these goals.

Spare the Air – Cool the Climate establishes the Air District as a leader in the effort to achieve the integrated goals of climate stabilization and healthy air for all. Staff will provide the Committee with an overview of the stationary source measures proposed in the draft Plan and the expected rule development activities associated with the measures.

BUDGET CONSIDERATION/FINANCIAL IMPACT

Resources to develop the 2017 Clean Air Plan are included in the Fiscal Year Ending (FYE) 2017 budget. Resources to implement the Plan will be included in the FYE 2018 and subsequent budgets.
