Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

- Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
- Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)

- Assembly Bill (AB) 923 allowed for additional \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
- CMP and Lower Emission School Bus Program (LESBP)
 projects eligible for MSIF funding



Community Health Protection Grant Program (CHP)

- Created by AB 134 appropriation of \$250 million from the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF) to reduce mobile source emissions including criteria pollutants, toxic air contaminants, and greenhouse gases in AB 617 communities
- Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District) allocated \$50 million of these funds for emission reduction projects under the CMP, and optionally under the Proposition 1B Goods Movement Emission Reduction Program



On 2/21/18 Air District Board of Directors:

- Approved participation in CMP Year 20
- Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to execute contracts and amendments with grant awards up to \$100,000

On 12/20/17 Air District Board of Directors:

• Approved acceptance of \$50 million in AB 134 funding for the Community Health Protection Grant Program (CHP)



CMP/MSIF & CHP Project Recommendations Over \$100k

- \$4,946,461 in total awards for 7 projects:
 - 1 agricultural equipment unit
 - 10 pieces of off-road equipment
 - 5 school buses
 - 1 marine engine
 - 1 locomotive
- Emission reductions:
 - Over 16.863 Tons Per Year (TPY) of criteria pollutants

Funding Sources

- Carl Moyer Program (CMP)
 - Created in 1998 to reduce emissions from heavy-duty engines
 - Voluntary program that funds surplus emission reductions

- Mobile Source Incentive Fund (MSIF)
 - Assembly Bill (AB) 923 allowed \$2 motor vehicle registration fee surcharge (12/04)
 - CMP projects eligible for MSIF funding



CMP Year 21 Funding

• California Air Resources Board (ARB) Year 21

>\$70.7 million statewide
■Up to \$12.8 million for Bay Area
>6.25% allocation for administrative costs
>Up to \$2 million in required match

- ARB 2017 CMP guidelines
- Continued focus on projects benefiting Community Air Risk Evaluation (CARE) areas
- Proposed \$3 million MSIF in match for additional CMP projects



2019 Caltrain Funding Plan

- July 29, 2015 Air District Board (Board):
 - Allocated \$20 million in MSIF funds for Caltrain electrification project
 - Authorized Executive Officer/APCO to enter into necessary agreements
 - Requested a multi-year funding plan be brought annually to Board for approval
 - January 7, 2016
 - March 16, 2016
 - March 1, 2017

- executed project agreement
- \$13 million initial MSIF funding plan and allocation
- \$3 million in MSIF funds allocated
- February 21, 2018 \$3 million in MSIF funds allocated

Final allocation of \$1 million in MSIF funds completes funding commitment

- Revenue service projected 2022
- Air District funds paid to date: \$6.97 million











Recommendations

Recommend the Board of Directors:

- Adopt a resolution authorizing the Executive Officer/APCO to execute all necessary agreements with the ARB relating to the Air District's receipt of CMP funds for fiscal year 2018-2019 (Program Year 21);
- 2. Allocate \$3 million in Mobile Source Incentive Funding to provide the required match funding and additional monies for projects eligible for funding under the CMP guidelines; and
- 3. Approve the proposed 2019 funding plan for the Caltrain Electrification project.

2018 Emissions Reductions

- 368 tons per year (TPY) of criteria pollutant emissions reduced
 - Equivalent to removing over
 62,000 vehicles off the road
- 22,239 TPY* of carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions reduced *Not all programs report CO₂ reductions
