#### **Bay Area Clean Air Foundation**

#### 2019 Annual Report

#### 1. Background

On July 9, 2008, the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District) Board of Directors approved the establishment of an Air District foundation. As a result of that action, the Bay Area Clean Air Foundation (Foundation) was established in September 2008. The purposes of the Foundation are as follows:

- To *provide* financial, administrative, programmatic, and other forms of support to the Air District; and
- To *engage* in activities that further serve such purposes.

The Foundation will serve to fund various air quality emissions reduction, and educational and service programs to support the mission of the Air District, which is "to protect and improve public health, air quality, and the global climate."

#### 2. Report on the Foundation's Activities

This report provides the Foundation Directors the proposed budget for 2020, the financial report for the prior fiscal year, and an update on the activities related to funds received for a project to deploy zero emissions equipment and vehicles in and around West Oakland that is funded by the Reformulated Gasoline (RFG) Open Grants Program.

#### **Project Background**

The Reformulated Gasoline (RFG) Open Grants Program was the result of the settlement of 14 class action lawsuits against Union Oil Company of California and Unocal Corporation. Before trial, the Plaintiff and Unocal agreed to settle the class actions and agreed to distribute approximately \$7 million through an open competitive grants program directed to nonprofit organizations for projects to achieve vehicle emissions or fuel efficiency benefits for California consumers. The majority of the RFG grants program funding was awarded in 2010, including a grant to the Bay Area Clean Air Foundation (BACAF) for a project to deploy ten converted plugin electric vehicles in car-share service in partnership with City CarShare.

On September 25, 2017, the U.S. District Court approved a grant in an amount not to exceed \$1,300,000 under the Open Grants Program, which represents the final tranche of RFG funding, whereby the Foundation, contracting with the Air District, will provide financial incentives to support the adoption of zero and near-zero equipment and vehicles in and near the Port of Oakland; collect data to measure environmental, economic and operating benefits of grant-funded equipment and vehicles; publish a White Paper describing the program, benefits, and lessons learned; and disseminate the White Paper to local governments, air districts and other entities with an interest in implementing similar programs.

#### **Discussion**

Under contract with BACAF, the Air District developed a West Oakland Zero-Emission Grant Program (Program) that will provide up to 50 percent of the cost of new on- and off-road zero-emission vehicles, infrastructure, and mobile and stationary equipment that is operated and installed in and around West Oakland and adjacent Air District designated Community Air Risk Evaluation (CARE) areas of Richmond and Western Alameda County. These communities experience disproportionately higher air pollution impacts, especially from diesel particulate matter emitted from vehicles and equipment that operate in and around the Port of Oakland (Port) and from traffic traveling along the adjacent freeways.

Since May 2018, a total of 22 applications have been received and evaluated resulting in awards to nine projects totaling approximately \$1 million in RFG funds. In addition to RFG funds awarded to these projects, the Air District also awarded approximately \$570,000 of its Transportation Fund for Clean Air funding to eligible projects as match. Through the awarded projects, an estimated 281,400 gallons of petroleum, 7.5 tons of criteria air pollutants, and 3,100 tons of CO2 will be reduced over the next five years in and around the West Oakland community. The awards to these nine projects leave approximately \$158,000 in RFG funding unobligated and available for award. The Air District is currently reviewing three project applications that were received by early February 2020 that, if eligible, would exhaust available funding.

On March 4, 2020, BACAF submitted a proposal to the RFG administrators seeking the authority to award any remaining funds, including fall-out from active projects and new revenues that are offered to BACAF by the RFG, to eligible clean air/fuel efficiency projects that are identified through the Air District's other grant programs in cases where funding from the applicant, Carl Moyer, the Air District's Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA), California's Hybrid and Zero-Emission Truck and Bus Voucher Incentive Project (HVIP), or other sources are not sufficient.

Applicants that apply after funding has been exhausted may be placed on a contingency list in case additional funding becomes available.

Recommend the Board of Directors as a Sole Member of the Bay Area Clean Air Foundation (Foundation):

1) Reappoint Damian Breen to a third two-year term as a Director of the Bay Area Clean Air Foundation.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Pursuant to the Bylaws of the Bay Area Clean Air Foundation, Directors of the Foundation serve two-year terms. The Bylaws further provide that a Foundation Director may serve no more than three consecutive two-year terms but may serve again after taking a one-year hiatus. Damian Breen, Director of the Bay Area Clean Air Foundation, has reached the end of his second two-year term. The Board of the Foundation recommends that Mr. Breen be reappointed to fill the Director seat.
