BARC Work Plan Updates

- 1. Climate Resiliency: State Legislative Engagement
- 2. AB 617 Implementation: Oakland Community Action Plan
- 3. Building Electrification: Community Climate Compass



Climate Resiliency: State Legislative Engagement

- Multiple \$5bn resiliency bonds are currently being proposed at the State level
 - Senate Bill 45 (Allen)
 - Proposed 2020-21 Governor's Budget
- AB 2148 (Quirk)
 - Would outline the regional role in supporting multihazard climate adaptation efforts
- BARC is coordinating recommendations to the state legislature on regional needs and roles



Climate Resiliency: State Legislative Engagement (continued)

BARC recommendations being explored:

- Disbursement of bond funds through Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) and Councils of Governments (COGs) rather than state-level competitive grants
- \$500m in bond proceeds allocated to Bay Restoration Authority to continue wetland restoration and flood prevention projects
- One-time \$50m investment for local government advanced planning and regional technical assistance



AB617 Implementation: West Oakland Community Action Plan

BARC Activities:

- Formed Goods Movement Collaborative Working Group (BAAQMD, MTC, Port of Oakland, Alameda CTC, CalTrans District 4, Solano Transportation Authority)
- Goal: Identify opportunities for near-term joint funding proposals for emissions reduction projects of regional importance
 - Initial focus on SB1 Trade Corridor Enhancement Program (TCEP) for projects on or near the Port of Oakland
 - Working group recommended Roundhouse EV Charging Facility at Port of Oakland
 - Work is currently delayed due to COVID-19; State will adopt new postponed deadlines in May



AB617 Implementation: West Oakland Community Action Plan (continued)

Next steps

- Continuing to lead Working Group to coordinate Roundhouse EV Charging Facility proposal
- Working with BAAQMD, MTC staff, and AB617 steering committee to identify priority projects for other upcoming external funding sources (e.g., Regional Measure 3)



Building Electrification: Community Climate Compass

BARC Activities:

- BARC staff are collaborating with Air District staff and the Building Decarbonization Coalition on development of Clean Building Compass, a web-based toolkit for local government building decarbonization
- Project Timeline
 - Oct. 2019-Jan. 2020: Scoping, content development and outreach
 - Feb. 2020: Focus groups with local government staff and building decarbonization experts from around the Bay Area
 - Mar.-May 2020: Final web development
 - Early Summer 2020: Public launch

Bottom-up (Facility Migration): Captured 6K facilities across eight (8) sources Highest bang for the buck Nothing "easy" left




Permitting and Compliance System: Current Production Features






Legacy System: Migration Status






Remaining Legacy Features: Permits & Applications






Design Refresh **Public Data Center Dynamic Maps Usage Metrics**





























Dynamic Web Maps: Air Quality Forecast





Dynamic Web Maps: Facilities







 - Wildfire Smoke Clean Air Center Incentive Program for Vulnerable Populations
 - State approved \$5.5 million to fund ventilation retrofits (January 2020)
- Adopted New Rule Amendments
 - Regulation 5 (Opening Burning)
 - o Regulation 6, Rule 3 (Wood Burning Devices)
- **Formed Regional Partnerships**
- **Established Common Goals and Messaging**
 - Wildfire Smoke Preparedness Tips
 - Air Quality School Guidance

2020 Wildfire Program Objectives



- Cleaner Air Centers (AB 836)
 - Develop funding guidelines with the State
 - Advance partnerships and regional coordination
- Wildfire Prevention Chipping Pilot Program
 - Provide chipping services as a sustainable alternative to open burning
- Emergency Episode Plan
 - Develop regional emergency plan to address future disasters
 - Provide general guidance or voluntary measures to better prepare for wildfires

2020 Wildfire Program Objectives (cont'd)

Air Quality Data – Regional & Local

- Continue to provide regional air quality forecasts, alerts, and current conditions during wildfires
- Develop Bay Air Center to help build community understanding of air quality data at the *local* level

Public Messaging, Media & Outreach

- Deliver clear and consistent messaging about the health impacts of wildfires
- Extend health messaging to non-English speakers
- Expand public notification alerts
