


Background: Exposure

Bay Area Cancer Risk Historical Trends




Cancer Risk, 2016

Background: Vulnerability




Areas with poor air quality also tend to have higher community health

Rule Development Process and Engagement



- Staff met internally and with community advocacy organizations to develop potential concepts and hear recommendations on how the permitting process could be more health protective
- Potential concepts to amend the Permitting Regulation presented at workshop in May 2021 to receive public feedback
- Draft amendments to Rules 2-1 and 2-5 presented at workshop in August 2021 to receive public feedback
- Proposed amendments to Rules 2-1 and 2-5 released in October 2021 for public review and comment

Proposed Amendments to Rules 2-1 and 2-5



Increasing health protections in Overburdened Communities

- (1) Overburdened Community Defined
- (2) More stringent cancer risk limit in Overburdened Communities
- (3) Enhanced Public Notifications
- (4) Update Gasoline Dispensing Facilities Health Risk Screening Guidelines
- 5 Permit Review Timelines

Rule 2-1 Proposed Amendments



Regulation 2, Rule 1: General Requirements (Rule 2-1)

Overburdened Community Definition: census tract ≥70th percentile CalEnviroScreen Version 4.0 or within 1,000 feet of any such tract

(2) Enhanced notification for projects within Overburdened Communities

Rule 2-1 Proposed Amendments (cont.)



Regulation 2, Rule 1: General Requirements (Rule 2-1)



Extend permit application completeness review from 21 days to:

- 30 days for routine applications
- 60 days for complex applications

Extend Permit application review period from 49 days:

- 90 days for routine applications
- 180 days for complex applications

Rule 2-5 Proposed Amendments (cont.)



Regulation 2, Rule 5: New Source Review of Toxic Air Contaminants (Rule 2-5)

(1) Extend lookback period in the project definition from 3 → 5 years

Essential Public Service defined to mean

- 2
- A police or fire fighting facility
- A hospital or other medical emergency facility; or
- A building designated as an emergency shelter location
- More stringent cancer risk limit of 6 in one million in Overburdened Communities

Rule 2-5 Proposed Amendments (cont.)



Regulation 2, Rule 5: New Source Review of Toxic Air Contaminants (Rule 2-5)

- Updates to Table 2-5-1: new and revised Health Effects Values adopted by Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA), draft acute trigger levels for consistency with Rule 11-18
- (5) Other housekeeping and clean up of redundant rule language

Gasoline Dispensing Facilities



2015

Update Air District Health Risk Assessment (HRA) Guidelines to reflect use of 2015 OEHHA HRA Guidelines for gas stations

Costs and Socioeconomic Impacts



- Significant impacts expected when costs exceed 10% of net income
- Scenarios at low, medium and high control cost

On average, no significant impacts

Significant impacts for the following at highest control cost scenarios:

Nursing and Residential Care Facilities Residential Buildings **Telecommunications**

Soil Vapor Extraction

Environmental Impacts



- California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)
- Analysis found no significant adverse environmental impacts
- CEQA Initial Study and Notice of Intent to Adopt Negative Declaration

Statutory Findings

- Before adopting, amending, or repealing a rule the Board of Directors must make findings of necessity, authority, clarity, consistency, non-duplication and reference (California H&SC Section 40727)
 - Necessity H&SC Section 40727(b)(1)
 - Authority H&SC Section 40727(b)(2)
 - Clarity H&SC Section 40727(b)(3)
 - Consistency H&SC Section 40727(b)(4)
 - Non-duplication H&SC Section 40727(b)(5)
 - Reference H&SC Section 40727(b)(6)

Air District Impacts



- Implementation of proposed amendments will require additional full-time equivalents (FTE) staff resources
 - Engineering: 8 additional FTEs
 - Meteorology and Measurement: 3 additional FTEs
 - Compliance and Enforcement: 1 additional FTE
- Consideration in future amendments to Regulation 3: Fees






Rule 2-5: Potentially Impacted Projects

Projects with Cancer Risk of 6-10 in One Million in Overburdened Communities between February 2017 - February 2021









Costs and Socioeconomic Impacts



Gasoline Dispensing Facilities – "Lookback Analysis"

Maximum control technology is already required

Additional controls by limiting throughput

Cancer Risk Impacts

2 facilities impacted and would have had to reduce throughput

\$183,000 / year

HRA Guideline Impacts

1 facility impacted and would have had to reduce throughput

\$16,000 / year
