

Current Status Fiscal Year Ending (FYE) 2022



- Permit and Asbestos revenues are up
 - Q4 of FYE 2021 showed Permit fees at 120% and Asbestos fees at 221% of budget trend is expected to continue into 2022
- Economic activity has rebounded in the Bay Area
 - US economy grew at a historically high rate during 2021
 - A short-lived recession during 2020, did not dent demand or capacity of the economy.
 - Final data for 2021 Q4 economic performance, to be released end-January 2022, is expected to show the best economy since 1984.
- Property Tax revenues holding steady
- Saving due to the Staff vacancy rate
- Reserves well above mandated minimums

- Continuation of discretionary contributions to address unfunded liabilities for Pension and Other Post Employment Benefits







Emissions: Air Pollution from Sources










Exposure: Amount of Pollution that People are Exposed to





Ambient Concentrations Over Time Short-term standard (24-hour PM_{2.5})



Ambient Concentrations Over Time Long-term standard (Annual PM_{2.5})







Ambient Concentrations Over Time Ozone (8-hour)





Overview of Stationary Sources



- Stationary Source = Not Mobile
- 11,200 Permitted Facilities & 27,599 Sources
- 82 Major Facilities

Examples:

- 5 Petroleum Refineries
- 7 Chemical Plants
- 20 Power Generation Facilities
- 16 Landfills/Composting Operations
- 2 Metal Melting Operations
- 1 Cement Facility



Key Stationary Source Issues Engineering



- Implementation of New Permit Rule Changes
- Regulation 11-18 Implementation
 - Program deadlines have slipped
 - Staff proposed program amendments to catch up
- Permit Application Backlog
 - Significant numbers of Backup Generator and Soil Vapor Extraction application in 2021
- Alternative Fuels Permit Applications
 - Both facility's Draft Environmental Impact Statements are out for public comment
- Bay View Hunters Point Cement and Materials Facilities





Key Stationary Source Issues Enforcement

• Operational Changes:

- Focus in Impacted Communities
 - Prioritizing Woodsmoke and Other Complaints
 - Staff Deployment and Facility Inspections
 - Tighter Integration between Enforcement and the Legal Division
- Enhance Investigation Capacity
- Focus on transparency
 - More use of the Air District's Hearing Board



Key Stationary Source Issues Enforcement (cont.)

Refineries

- 2021 Increased Flaring, Deviations and Notice of Violations (NOVs)
- Increased Enforcement, New Rules, Rule Amendments and Monitoring
- South Bay Odor Study
 - Release of study finding and recommendations



Wildfires



2021 - Approximately 2,568,948 Acres burned due to wildfires (equivalent to >50% of the Bay Area Landmass)

2022 – Difficult to get out of current drought and above average temperatures forecast for summer months

2022 Wildfire Response Focus Areas:

- Implementation \$3 million Assembly Bill (AB) 836, Wildfire Smoke Clean Air Centers Incentive Program for Vulnerable Populations
- Wildfire Prevention Chipping Pilot Program
- Development of new \$1 Million Program:
 - Community Discussion
 - Home Air Filtration Program
 - USEPA Support Grant



About AB 617



- Partner with communities to co-develop solutions to address higher levels of air pollution in historically underrepresented communities.
- Address exposure to harmful air pollutants in impacted communities.
- Anchoring the work to be community-led



West Oakland and Richmond-North Richmond-San Pablo



West Oakland

- With West Oakland Environmental Indicators Project, continuing to center equity in implementation
- Recruiting more community residents to engage in the Steering Committee

Richmond-North Richmond-San Pablo

- Welcomed and orienting new Steering Committee members
- Working on co-creating elements of the emissions reduction plan, including creating strategies informed by community-identified priorities and observations from community mapping

East Oakland: AB 617 Nomination



- November 3, 2021: Air District Board approved the East Oakland nomination on the following basis:
 - Advocated for selection each year
 - Decades of building community capacity, leadership development
 - Low-income, community of color, history of environmental injustice
- February 10, 2022: CARB announces new AB 617 communities
- Currently, developing partnerships with Communities for a Better Environment (CBE) and other community groups
- Visioning Community Steering Committee and composition
- Scoping community data and information needs

Other Work in AB 617 Communities



Participatory Budgeting

- Planning to work with The Participatory Budgeting Project to train staff participatory budgeting on models and practices
- Develop processes at the Air District with AB 617 communities and the Community Advisory Council

Expanded Partnerships in Communities

 In places, such as Eastern San Francisco, partnering with South of Market Community Action Network (SOMCAN) to expand community outreach to Filipino communities in Eastern San Francisco and leverage these relationships for AB 617 work

Improved Equity in Grant Making



- One aligned grant program
 - Focus on equity across grant processes
 - Improve outreach and accessible reporting
- Invest in deeper, stronger community partnerships
 - Support capacity-building efforts
 - Offer multi-year grant awards
 - Increase available grant amounts
 - Continued program evaluation & Improvement

Expanded Grantmaking in Environmental Justice Communities



Previous Community Grant Programs

James Cary Smith Grants (2016)

- To date, 42 grants awarded to community-based organizations
- Up to \$25,000 each for one year

Community Health Protection Grants (2019)

- 7 grantees from AB 617 Communities
- \$50,000 each for two years

Aligned Community Grant Program

James Cary Smith Community Grant Program

- 35 grantees: 34 serving AB 617 communities; all Environmental Justice Communities defined using CalEnviroScreen 4.0
- Up to \$100,000 each for up to three years
- Total grants supporting Environmental Justice Communities: \$3,061,470







Community Response Home Air Filtration

- In 2021, provided over 350 air filters to community-based organizations working with vulnerable populations, including the unhoused, seniors and low-income and fence-line communities
 - Bayview Hunters Point Marie Harrison Foundation, United Council and Bayview Community Advocates
 - Belle Haven Belle Haven Action and Councilmember Cecilia Taylor
 - City of Millbrae Mayor Ann Schneider
 - West Oakland West Oakland Environmental Indicators Project and West Oakland Health Council
 - Vallejo All Positives Possible
 - Bayo Vista, Rodeo Healing Impacted Communities

School Air Filtration Supplemental Environmental Project (SEP)

 Completed installation of high-performance air filtration systems in 12 schools in Bay Area Community Air Risk Evaluation (CARE) Communities (\$2 million total, maintenance ongoing till end of 2025)







 - Address fine particulate matter (PM2.5)

- Finalize in-process rules:
