BACKGROUND

The Community Equity, Health and Justice Committee provides local and regional community environmental justice advocates and local leaders a platform to present and share their expertise and/or lived experiences. Specific subjects/topics will vary based upon each Community Perspective member's unique experience.

Founded in 1979, the San Francisco Bay Physicians for Social Responsibility is a nonprofit education and advocacy organization that combines the power of community activism with the knowledge and credibility of health professionals to promote public policies that support human and environmental health. The organization's work is anchored in racial, social, and environmental justice, climate change, and nuclear weapon abolition.

DISCUSSION

Dr. Ritterman is on the Board of Directors for the San Francisco Bay Physicians for Social Responsibility and a councilmember for the Air District's Community Advisory Council. Dr. Ritterman will discuss combating medical racism and air pollution.

Dr. Ritterman is a retired Chief of Cardiology at the Kaiser Permanente Richmond Medical Center where he worked for 29 years. He served on the Richmond City Council and proposed the first municipal soda tax. Although the measure failed, he worked to help pass a similar measure in Berkeley, CA and in Mexico. He is also an active Board member of the Human Rights Commission.

BACKGROUND

Availability in sensor technology, increased community-led air quality data collection, and a growing interest in local air quality issues and air quality data has resulted in a dramatic increase in the number of requests the Air District receives for technical support, training, and guidance around air monitoring, sensors, and air quality data. The Bay Air Center program was developed to be responsive to these evolving technical support needs of Bay Area communities. The Bay Air Center provides technical guidance, materials, and training to Bay Area community members and organizations, free of charge, to support their efforts to understand and improve air quality. The Bay Air Center is also intended to be a dynamic resource that is tailored to community-specific needs and is designed to accommodate a variety of requests on different areas of interest.

DISCUSSION

The purpose of this presentation is to provide the Community Equity, Health and Justice Committee and the public with an update and an opportunity to provide feedback on future direction of the Bay Air Center and the District's technical support for communities, including background on initial needs assessment, guiding principles, technical support to communities, recent accomplishments, and next steps for program planning and implementation.

BUDGET CONSIDERATION/FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Board approved the APCO to execute this contract on March 14, 2019 for an amount not to exceed \$540,000. The Board authorized the APCO to execute a contract amendment on June 3, 2020 to increase the not to exceed amount of the existing contract to \$1,013,000. The funds to support the remaining unspent amount for this contract are included in the FYE 2024 budget approved by the Board.
