Background



- Adoption of zero-emission medium- and heavy-duty equipment and vehicles is in early stages
- Charging infrastructure takes time to deploy and is critical for successful adoption of electric vehicles and equipment
- California Air Resources Board (CARB)-adopted guidelines for incentive programs provide additional flexibility for competitive solicitations that include selection criteria approved by an air district's board

Background



Goal: To spur the deployment of zero-emission vehicles and equipment in the Bay Area by funding permanent infrastructure installations

- Develop pilot to fund ready and needed, cost-effective projects
- Remove barriers that have been experienced in other solicitations
- Expedite zero-emissions projects in priority communities
- Learn and develop a model to use for future solicitations that can help spur the transition to zero-emission vehicles and equipment

Program Attributes



- \$30 million available
- Projects must comply with CARB-adopted Carl Moyer Program guidelines
- Public and private applicants are eligible
- Applications must demonstrate that project can be completed within two years from date of award and equipment is needed
- Award at least 80% of funding to projects in priority communities

- School Buses
- Heavy-duty Trucks

Off-road Equipment

- Agricultural Equipment
- Construction Equipment
- Forklifts
- Cargo Handling Equipment

Marine & Locomotives

Proposed Selection Criteria



- ✓ Statement of Need
- ✓ Readiness
- Ratio of funds requested / kW available for charging
- ✓ At least 80% of the funding for projects located in priority communities

If oversubscribed, tiebreaker would consider proximity of project to sensitive receptor



 Statutory authority set forth in California Health and Safety Code Sections 44241 and 44242

 Funding provided by a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicles



Proposed Projects



Recommend \$4,770,081 in awards for four projects that:

- Replace 8 diesel school buses with 8 electric buses & install supporting infrastructure*
- Install 12 DC fast chargers
- Replace a total of 9 Tier 1 & 2 diesel tractors with 9 Tier 4 final tractors

Emissions Reductions

Over 2.1 tons per year of criteria pollutants


* 6 buses previously approved but requesting approval of funding for 2 chargers
