Re: Strategic Plan Development

#### RECOMMENDED ACTION

None; receive and file.

#### **BACKGROUND**

In July 2023, the Air District sought and received authorization from the Board of Directors for the Executive Officer/APCO to execute a contract with BluePoint Planning for the development of an agency-wide Strategic Plan. The strategic planning effort is to culminate in a five-year plan that includes strategic goals and prioritized objectives and strategies with measurable results, based on input from communities, other stakeholders, Board members, and Air District staff. The strategic plan will align with the environmental justice work that the Metropolitan Group is facilitating with the Air District and the Community Advisory Council and its Environmental Justice Policy Ad Hoc committee.

The Board of Directors received an overview of the initial stages of the strategic plan's development on November 1, 2023. In addition, the Board's strategic planning Ad Hoc committee reviewed progress and provided input on September 20, 2023, and January 3, 2024. During Fall 2023, Air District staff provided input through Division-level small-group meetings; Community Advisory Council members responded to surveys and engaged in interviews; partner agencies and other external stakeholders gave early input; and members of the Board of Directors were interviewed. At today's session, BluePoint Planning will summarize this extensive outreach, present a draft framework of the Air District's strategic plan based on this input, and seek feedback from the Board of Directors.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The strategic plan's framework includes the Air District's mission, core values, vision for the next five years, and strategic goals. Updates to prior versions of the mission and core values are suggested, and a new draft vision statement is offered, all crafted from the extensive input. Four broad strategic goal areas will also be described. BluePoint Planning, in part through an interactive presentation tool, will offer opportunities for Board members' informal reactions to

each of these elements.

Importantly, environmental justice strategic priorities will serve as a foundation of the strategic plan. As part of the presentation, the Metropolitan Group's Executive Vice-President will describe how these priorities will inform the plan and will give an overview of the efforts thus far to align the EJ work, including the EJ Action Plan, with development of the strategic plan.

During Spring 2024, strategies to carry out the plan's goals will be drafted and prioritized by Air District staff. Additional sessions with the Board's strategic planning Ad Hoc committee will be held, and a draft plan will be presented to the Board of Directors' Finance and Administration Committee in late Spring. The plan is anticipated to be complete by June 2024.

#### BUDGET CONSIDERATION/FINANCIAL IMPACT

None; funds for this project were previously authorized by the Board of Directors.
