#### **Hearing Board Fact Sheet**

This information will help you understand the Hearing Board process and how to participate at the upcoming meeting on March 15, 2022.

### What is the Bay Area Air Quality Management District's independent Hearing Board?

The Hearing Board is established by state law and consists of five members and their alternates— an attorney, a professional engineer, a member from the medical profession, and two members of the public.

#### What authority does the Hearing Board have?

The Hearing Board is a quasi-judicial body that rules on particular cases that affect only individual facilities. It is authorized to hear the abatement order request the Air District has brought against Valero's Benicia facility.

## Why is the Valero Hydrogen Vent Enforcement Case being brought before the Hearing Board?

Bringing the proposed abatement order before the Hearing Board allows for transparency as facts and evidence are presented in a public forum.

## Can the public participate in the Hearing Board process?

Yes. The Hearing Board process provides an opportunity for public comment. Public comments are encouraged and welcomed as the agency works to hold polluters accountable.
