## Air District Proposes Revisions to Title V Refinery Permits

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District) has made a preliminary decision to revise the Title V permits for the five major Bay Area refineries and for Valero Benicia Asphalt Products. In 2003 the Air District issued Title V permits to these facilities. The permits have been reopened to revised and incorporate recently adopted amendments to Air District rules, most notably requirements for flare monitoring at refineries.

The public comment period for the draft permits will continue until March 31, 2004. During this time, any member of the public may comment on any changes that have been proposed. Copies of the proposed permits can be found:

## What is Title V?

Title V is part of the federal Clean Air Act and requires all state and local governments to develop and implement operating permits for all major air pollution emitting facilities. The EPA oversees these permit programs and the Air District is charged with implementing them in the Bay Area, in accordance with Federal guidelines. For more information about the Air District, visit www.baagmd.gov.

Title V is intended to make compliance with complex air quality requirements easier by consolidating the multitude of federal, state, and local air pollution control regulations into one summary operating permit that covers all aspects of a facility's year-to-year air pollution activities.

Public comments are important to the Title V process. A final decision will incorporate consideration of public comments on the proposed revisions.
