Air District & MTC to launch Bay Area Bike Share

SAN FRANCISCO - On Thursday, August 29, the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District), the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) and their project partners will launch the Bay Area Bike Share pilot program at a press event in San Francisco.

After the launch, the public will have access to 700 shared bicycles 24 hours a day at specific locations along the Caltrain corridor within the cities of San Francisco, Redwood City, Palo Alto, Mountain View and San Jose.
