Fleet of electric delivery trucks coming to SF Goodwill

Project to demonstrate viability of electric commercial delivery trucks on Bay Area roads

SAN FRANCISCO – The Bay Area Air District and partners are announcing the kickoff of a first-of-its-kind project to test the viability of deploying a fleet of electric delivery trucks in the region. Eleven electric delivery trucks will serve Goodwill locations in San Mateo, San Francisco, and Marin counties to provide a national model to electrify Goodwill’s truck fleet, increase market adoption for electric trucks generally, and reduce greenhouse gases and air pollution locally.

- WHAT:** Media availability to kick-off the Goodwill electric delivery truck project. View a demonstration electric delivery truck.
- WHERE:** 1500 Mission Street, San Francisco, inside the adjacent parking lot (donation area).
- WHEN:** Friday, April 7, at 10:00 a.m.
- WHY:** Accelerate the commercialization of heavy-duty electric trucks; reduce diesel emissions and greenhouse gases.
- WHO:** Assemblymember Phil Ting (D-San Francisco). Representatives from the Bay Area Air District and the California Air Resources Board, along with SF Goodwill, BYD Motors, and The Center for Transportation and the Environment.

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District (www.baaqmd.gov) is the regional agency responsible for protecting air quality in the nine-county Bay Area.
