Air District offers \$4 million to support existing public agency shuttle bus and ridesharing services

SAN FRANCISCO - Today the Bay Area Air Quality Management District announced the availability of up to \$4 million dollars to support existing shuttle/feeder bus and ridesharing services.

Only public agencies currently operating existing services are eligible for funding.

"Transportation is the largest source of air pollution in the Bay Area and must be addressed in a wide range of ways to protect public health," said Jack Broadbent, executive officer of the Air District. "Shuttle bus and ridesharing services link commuters with mass transit and play a key role in helping the region attain its clean air goals by eliminating commute trips."

Funding comes from the Transportation Fund for Clean Air, which are revenues collected from a \$4 surcharge on motor vehicles registered in the Bay Area. Approximately 22 million dollars annually is used to fund a variety of programs and projects to mitigate the impact of vehicle emissions. Recently funded programs and projects include the Spare the Air program, programs to reduce single occupancy vehicle trips by providing last-mile solutions to link commuters to public transit and programs to accelerate the adoption of clean air vehicles.
