## Day 1: Transparency, Innovation and Environmental Justice in Practice

The retreat opened with welcoming remarks from **Lynda Hopkins**, Chair of the Air District's Board of Directors. The first day centered on community perspectives and innovative approaches to air quality monitoring:

## Day 2: Integrating EJ into Core Functions and Community Investments

The second day of the retreat opened with welcoming remarks from **Dr. Philip M. Fine**, executive officer of the Air District. The second day focused on policy, compliance and investments to support equitable outcomes:

- Notice of Violation Trends and Legal Remedies: Council Member Patrick Messac and Alexander Crockett, general counsel, presented data trends and legal tools being used to address air pollution violations across the Bay Area.
- Targeted Inspection Program and Policy: Dennis Quach, air quality specialist, introduced a new inspection approach informed by compliance data and community insights, including a pilot project in Bayview Hunters Point.

- Managing Community
   Investments: Miriam Torres,

   of regional funding strategies
   through the Community
   Investments Office, including
   allocation of penalty funds and the Local Community Benefits
   Fund.
