Wood Smoke in the Bay Area

- Wood smoke is the major source of air pollution in the Bay Area in the wintertime
 1.4 million fireplaces and wood stoves
- Wood burning generates fine particulate matter (PM 2.5) and carcinogenic substances that make the air harmful to breathe
- Local and regional air quality concerns





Winter Spare the Air Alerts

- Designates when there is unhealthy air in the Bay Area
 - November February
- When a Winter Spare the Air Alert is issued, it is illegal to burn wood unless you are "exempt" from the Rule

Regulation 6, Rule 3: Wood Burning Devices



- Limit emissions of particulate matter (PM) and visible emissions from wood burning devices
- Reduce local and regional fine particulate emissions


- Update and clarify requirements of the Rule
 - Exemptions
 - Definitions
 - Standards
 - Administrative Requirements
- Adopt new EPA emissions standards for new wood heaters
- Incorporate improved wood heater technologies and promote cleaner and more efficient devices to reduce wood smoke



Exemptions

Exempt

Not Exempt



No wood burning allowed during a Winter Spare the Air Alert

(No burning wood, manufactured fire logs, pellets or any other solid fuels in fireplaces, wood stoves or outdoor fire pits)



Proposed Reg 6-3 Exemptions

Sole Source of Heat Exemption

- Only Source of Heat
- Non-Functional, Permanently Installed Heating Device
- Loss of Electric Power and/or Natural Gas





Exemption - Only Source of Heat

YOU ARE EXEMPT

Effective November 1, 2016

YOU HAVE NO ALTERNATE FORM OF HEAT

YOUR WOOD BURNING DEVICE IS EPA CERTIFIED

YOUR EPA CERTIFIED DEVICE
IS REGISTERED
WITH THE DISTRICT



Exemption - Non-Functional, Permanently Installed Heater

YOUR HEATER IS NON-FUNCTIONAL AND NEEDS REPAIR

YOU RECEIVE A TEMPORARY EXEMPTION

Effective November 1, 2015

YOU HAVE NO ALTERNATE FORM OF HEAT

YOU REPAIR YOUR HEATER WITHIN 30 DAYS AND YOU SUBMIT REPAIR DOCUMENTATION WITHIN 10 DAYS OF COMPLETION TO THE DISTRICT



Exemption - Utility Service Outage

YOU RECEIVE A TEMPORARY EXEMPTION

Effective November 1, 2015

YOU HAVE NO GAS AND/OR ELECTRIC SERVICE

THE SERVICE OUTAGE IS VERIFIABLE BY YOUR LOCAL UTILITY SERVICE PROVIDER




Mandatory Burn Ban


Reg 6-3 Definitions

Proposed Change:



- "Curtailment Period" to "Mandatory Burn Ban"
- Declare a Winter Spare the Air Alert 2-3 days sooner to prevent an exceedance of the federal health standard
- 4 to 5 more Winter Spare the Air Alerts estimated

Visible Emissions Limitation



Sales and Manufacturing of New Wood Heaters

- EPA revised New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) for new wood heaters
- New standard affects manufacturers and retailers
- Wood heaters that do not comply with the new emission standards can no longer be sold after December 1, 2015



New EPA New Source Performance Standards (NSPS)




Tier	Emissions Rating	Compliance Dates
1	4.5 g/hr	May 15, 2015
2	2.0 g/hr	May 15, 2020
	2.5 g/hr	

^{*}Wood heaters rated 4.6 g/hr - 7.5 g/hr can no longer be sold after December 1, 2015

*Requirement is trigged by a fireplace or chimney remodel that requires a local building permit.



Commercial and Residential Rental Property

Effective November 1, 2016 MUST HAVE AN ALTERNATE FORM OF HEAT THAT DOES NOT BURN WOOD

REPLACE AN UNCERTIFIED WOOD BURNING DEVICE WITH ONE OF THE FOLLOWING DEVICES:

GAS-FUELED,
ELECTRIC, OR
EPA CERTIFIED DEVICE

^{*} May decommission or render inoperable



New Building Construction

ALL NEW BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

Effective November 1, 2015

NEW BUILDING CONSTRUCTION MAY ONLY INSTALL:

GAS-FUELED
OR
ELECTRIC DEVICES
ONLY



DISTRICT Visible Emissions Limitation

Proposed Standard

- No visible emissions of greater than 20% opacity and totaling to 3 minutes in any hour
- 20 minute start-up allowance for new fires; not to be exceeded in any consecutive 4 hour period





Administrative Requirement



Proposed Administrative Requirement

Registration Program

All residential dwellings that claim "Only Source of Heat" exemption must register their EPA certified device.

- Type of Device
- Manufacturer's Name
- Model #
- Device certification date

Proposed Effective Date: November 1, 2016
