12-15-22 Cynthia Pena, Crockett, sent email, did not receive response back... no auto response, (phone redacted)

Community were not adequately informed; Friend in Benicia showing the notice; did refinery did due diligence in informing the community

12-14-22 Judith Sullivan, Benicia, Member of Benicians for Safe and Healthy Communities

Odor control, emissions release concerns, real time monitoring of toxics, with notification to communities affected

Safety equipment for such types of materials such as tallow

Review/processing too fast, will be very toxic for surrounding areas, depending on wind patterns

Short response period

EIR and eval weren't noticed or communicated to community with adequate advance notice prior to commenting; did not have time to respond before EIR public notice period expired

Permit shouldn't be issued until there's real-time data of emissions/odors of surrounding community to allow people to put on masks if needed and access to raw data

Odor abatement and any other measures should be in place to control emission releases prior to permitting; scrubbers?

Every attempt to limit non-liquid forms of feedstocks (tallow and animal fat), bad feedstock since it can solidify easily, hard to store, odors, harmful

Adequate storage for most harmful feedstocks

Rushed process, should have more community input before issuance; Crockett residents and other areas did not even know about this project
