

Impacted Communities

- CARE program identifies 6 priority communities in Bay Area
 - Exposure of youth and seniors to toxics
 - High emissions of toxics
 - Vulnerable populations – low income
 - Roadways as primary boundaries
- Focus comprehensive emission reduction strategies through Clean Air Communities Initiative
- Seek to reduce impacts from land use, transportation decisions
- Promote infill, while protecting residents





Bay Area Healthy Communities Resolution

Establish Board policy to identify, track and reduce local air quality impacts

- Resolution includes several elements:
 - Formally adopt the CARE Impacted Community boundaries
 - Adopt a policy of “No Net Increase” for CARE communities
 - Direct staff to identify baseline emission levels for each CARE community
 - Direct staff to conduct enhanced monitoring in CARE communities
 - Direct staff to continue targeting District grants in impacted communities
 - Direct staff to collaborate with local jurisdictions in developing Community Risk Reduction Plans for impacted communities





Advances District Initiatives

Resolution supports and advances various District initiatives related to local AQ impacts

- Board resolution to Continue to Reduce Air Contaminants in Impacted Communities (July 2008)
- CARE program
- Clean Air Communities Initiative
- CEQA Guidelines
- Regulation 2-5





Board Direction

Board of Directors direction at December 16, 2009, and January 6, 2010, public hearings

- Address infill development
- Address economic vitality
