Introducing the BARCAP Team

The Opportunity for the Region

Funding

Regional approach that builds on existing work

Elevate frontline communities' priorities

Innovation

USEPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program

Funding for Climate Planning

- States get \$3 million
- Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) get \$1 million - Bay Area has 2 MSAs (central Bay and south Bay)

Funding for Project Implementation

- Nationally-competitive pot of \$4.3 billion
- For projects to implement measures in plan
- Projects must benefit low-income, disadvantaged "frontline" communities

Climate Planning Process

Phase 1: Priority Climate Action Plan (Mar 1, 2024)

- Targeted, narrative Plan focusing on 1-2 priority sectors;
- Simplified GHG inventory;
- Short list of high-priority, near-term GHG reduction measures;
- High level frontline communities' benefits analysis;
- Quantified GHG reductions, funding availability analysis

Phase 2: Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (Sept 2025)

- GHG inventory, projections and targets covering all sectors;
- Detailed frontline communities' benefits analysis;
- Quantified GHG and co-pollutant reductions for entire geographic scope;
- Funding availability analysis;
- Workforce analysis



Funding for Measure Implementation – CPRG NOFO Takeaways



Overview of the Structure

Total of 30-115 awards ranging from \$2million-\$500million (tiers) Eligible applicants include:

- Lead organizations for MSA planning grants
- Other municipal agencies, departments, or offices, local air pollution control agencies
- COGs, MPOs, or other regional organizations made of multiple municipalities
- A coalition of two or more eligible applicants



Emphasis on Coalitions

Why Form a Coalition?

- Scale and Impact
- Limited awards by location
 - EPA will not award multiple grants to implement the same measure in same location
 - EPA will award no more than two grants to applicants at the same level of government within a single jurisdiction (e.g., a single state, municipality)

What is a Coalition?

- Two or more eligible applicants where withdrawal of any single member would fundamentally alter the design or expected outputs and outcomes of the proposed measures
- Sign a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)



Goals for Implementation Grants

- Implement ambitious measures that will achieve *significant* cumulative GHG reductions by 2030 and beyond
- Pursue measures that will achieve *substantial community benefits*, esp. in low income and disadvantaged communities (e.g., criteria air pollutant, hazardous air pollutant reductions)
- Complement other funding sources to maximize these GHG reductions and community benefits
- Pursue innovative policies and programs that are replicable and can be "scaled up" across multiple jurisdictions

Key Scoring Criteria for Applications

Criteria	Components	Points
Impact of GHG reduction measures (emphasis on near-term)	Near-term and long-term cumulative GHG reductions, cost-effectiveness, documentation	60
Low-income and disadvantaged communities (frontline communities)	Community benefits, community engagement	35
Transformative impact		15
Demonstration of funding need		10
Job quality		5
Quality of application, etc	Budget, narrative, applicant strength	125
Total possible points		250

Types of GHG Reduction Measures

- New, stand-alone measure implemented <u>solely</u> through CPRG funding
- <u>Expansion</u> of measure already being implemented by using CPRG funding
- New measure for which applicant already secured partial funding
- Examples of measures from EPA include capital projects, policies (including codes, standards), programs (including incentives)

September 2025	CCAP due to EPA	

Key Takeaways

- Coalitions will likely be stronger applications
- Eligible measures include capital projects, programs, policies, standards (or a combination)
- Emphasis is on cumulative GHG reductions with a focus on community benefits (defined by CEJST)
- Demonstration of strong funding need that's unmet by other funding sources
- Pioneering, replicable, scalable policies and programs or market transformations receive additional points



Process to Identify Measure Focus Areas for PCAP



Input from Local Government Staff

- Review of existing city and county climate action plans
- Multiple surveys of city and county staff followed by individual staff interviews (including transportation agencies)
- Input from county-led and CCA-led forums for city and county staff and community-based organizations

Input from Advisory Workgroup

Meets monthly to discuss and make decisions on key aspects of the project. Members include:



Building Upon Community Engagement Efforts

July – Sept 2023

- Air District synthesizes findings from:
 - Recent CE efforts for CAPs, GPs, EJ/housing elements, etc.;
 - Local government CE survey; and
 - External meetings

Sept – Dec 2023

• External roundtable reviews synthesis, develop prioritization criteria

Nov 2023 – Jan 2024

 Air District analyzes benefits of PCAP measures (qualitative) for frontline communities



Input from External Roundtable

- Review and discuss the Air District's synthesis of engagement efforts to highlight key needs & priorities of frontline communities
- Support the Air District and Advisory Work Group to develop equity-informed criteria for measure refinement











Considerations for Selecting Measure Focus Areas

- Potential for significant greenhouse gas reductions
- Priority identified through local government engagement
- Aligns with frontline communities' priorities/benefits
- Well-suited for regional approach (vs state or local)


- Authority to implement measures (local government, regional agencies, partners)
- Funding landscape (e.g., gaps)
- •Near-term timeline for implementation
- Transformative
