17 Projects Funded by the Air District's Climate Protection Grant Program

Congratulations to the <u>recently announced</u> awardees of the Air District's 2018 Climate Protection Grant Program. Funded projects will pilot new, innovative strategies and help to build regional markets for low-GHG technologies such as heat pumps and low-carbon concrete.

Awarded Projects:

San Francisco Department of Environment - Support local small businesses by providing training and incentives to maintain and repair leaking refrigeration equipment.

<u>Bay Area Regional Energy Network</u> - Build a regional market for heat-pump water heaters by addressing key barriers at every point in the supply chain.

<u>Contra Costa County</u> - Use a web-based platform to leverage public engagement and community-based social marketing for household-level GHG reductions.

<u>City of San Jose</u> - Offer incentives, trainings and market adoption strategies to electrify existing buildings, focusing on heat-pump water heaters.

<u>Marin County</u> - Implement a building decarbonization pilot program that provides public education and incentivizes the replacement of natural gas appliances.

<u>San Mateo Housing Endowment and Regional Trust</u> - Develop architectural designs and guidance to facilitate accessory dwelling unit development that is exclusively green.

<u>San Mateo County Community College District</u> - Train and place 22 Climate Corps Fellows to reduce GHGs in buildings across the Bay Area, achieving workforce development and energy efficiency goals. <u>Marin County</u> - Establish best practices, specifications, and model policies for using low-carbon concrete.

<u>City of Palo Alto Utilities</u> - Develop an appliance recycling program that exceeds the GHG emissions reduction capabilities of local recycling facilities.

<u>Alameda County Waste Management Authority</u> - StopWaste will develop a program that installs contamination reduction technology at food waste generating businesses.

<u>Silicon Valley Clean Energy</u> - Provide incentives and marketing to replace residential natural gas-fired water heaters with electric heat-pump water-heaters.

<u>City of Brisbane</u> - Develop a local ordinance requiring energy audits, benchmarking and retro-commissioning of commercial buildings.

East Bay Clean Energy (with Peninsula Clean Energy) - Research the potential for resilient solar systems on critical facilities and develop a financial model that results in widespread deployment.

<u>Sonoma County, Regional Climate Protection Authority</u> - Develop an electric bike bulk-discount, incentive and marketing program to increase e-bike use in Sonoma County.

<u>Silicon Valley Power</u> - Conduct pilot project to demonstrate the viability of replacing back-up diesel generators with electric energy storage systems at data centers.

<u>City of Palo Alto Utilities</u> - Replace gas wall furnaces with ductless mini-split heat pumps in multifamily buildings.

<u>City of Fremont</u> - Develop technical integration system for pairing solar PV systems with energy storage and electric vehicle infrastructure.
