AMENDMENTS TO REGULATION 3: FEES

On **Wednesday, April 15, 2015**, the Board of Directors of the Bay Area Air Quality Management District will conduct a public hearing to receive testimony on proposed amendments to District Regulation 3: Fees. The hearing will be held in the District Headquarters' Board Room, 7th floor, 939 Ellis Street, San Francisco. District Board meetings commence at 9:45 a.m.

The Board of Directors will conduct a second public hearing on Wednesday, June 3, 2015 to consider adoption of the proposed amendments to Regulation 3: Fees and to approve the filing of a Notice of Exemption from CEQA. California Health and Safety Code Section 41512.5 requires a district board, prior to adopting or revising fees applicable to emission sources that are not permitted, to hold a public hearing at least 30 days prior to the meeting of the district board at which the fees are adopted or revised. Fee Schedules L, Q, R, S and V pertain to fees from these sources.

The proposed amendments to the District's fee regulation would be effective on July 1, 2015 and would increase fee revenue in order to allow the District to meet budgetary needs for the upcoming fiscal year ending (FYE) 2016.

The rates in the Fee Schedules would be amended as follows: (1)) 2.6% increase: Schedule C: Storage of Organic Liquids, Schedule G5: Miscellaneous Sources, Schedule M: Major Stationary Sources, Schedule N: Toxic Inventory, Schedule Q: Excavation of Contaminated Soil and Removal of Underground Storage Tanks, Schedule U: Indirect Sources; (2) 7% increase: Schedule B: Combustion of Fuels, Schedule D: Gasoline Transfer at Gasoline Dispensing Facilities, Bulk Plants and Terminals, Schedule, Schedule I: Dry Cleaners, Schedule L: Asbestos Operations; (3) 8% increase: Schedule F: Miscellaneous Sources, and Schedule G3: Miscellaneous Sources; (4) 9% increase: Schedule A: Hearing Board Fees, Schedule E: Solvent Evaporating Sources, Schedule G1: Miscellaneous Sources, Schedule G4: Miscellaneous Sources, Schedule H: Semiconductor and Related Operations, Schedule K: Solid Waste Disposal Sites, Schedule P: Major Facility Review

Fees, Schedule R: Equipment Registration Fees, S: Naturally Occurring Asbestos Operations, and Schedule V: Open Burning. The following fees in Regulation 3 would be increased by 2.6%: New and modified source filing fees, emissions banking filing and withdrawal fees, Regulation 2, Rule 9 alternative compliance plan fees, and permit renewal processing fees.

In addition, proposed amendments to Schedule R: Equipment Registration fees would delete the facility registration fee in Section 4a and replace it with a registration fee per device of \$100. The fee to alter a permitted source in Section 3-304 would be amended to be the same as the fee to modify a source found in Section 3-302.

The District has determined that these amendments to Regulation 3 and Regulation 5 are exempt from provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.) pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15061, subd. (b)(3) and 15273. The amendments increase District fees that are used to meet District operating expenses. The amendments are administrative in nature, do not affect air emissions from any sources, and have no possibility of causing significant environmental effects. The District intends to file a Notice of Exemption pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines, Section 15062.
