Clean Air Centers for Vulnerable Population Grant Program (AB 836)

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
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Objective of AB 836

Help fund ventilation retrofit projects or portable air cleaners to provide vulnerable communities access to facilities with cleaner air when wildfire or other smoke events impacts the region.

\$3M of the \$5M from AB 836 was allocated to Bay Area Air Quality Management District.



Clean Air Center Project Types

Facility Ventilation Upgrade

 Funding for facility ventilation retrofits and high efficiency air filtration systems (MERV 13 or greater) in smoke burdened areas and those in close proximity to disadvantaged communities.

Portable Air Cleaner

- Funding for purchase of portable air cleaners for facilities in vulnerable and smoke burdened communities designated as emergency shelters.
- Must be certified by CARB and equipped with HEPA filter.

Air Filter Replacements

 Funding for HEPA or MERV 13 or greater replacement filters

Clean Air Center -Facility Types

Criteria

- 1. Facilities located in schools in or near historically underserved communities
- 2. Facilities that are close to and provide easy access for vulnerable populations
- 3. Facilities that have a reasonable capacity to meet the possible clean air center needs of vulnerable populations 4. Facilities that are ready for ventilation and filtration installation, upgrades, or retrofits




Historically Underserved Communities


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Smoke Burdened


Multiple days at or above EPA's "Unhealthy" category of AirNow Air Quality Index (or Air Quality Index of 150 or higher) in the past five years.

No. of Days with AQI > 150 (2016-2020)




Total Funding Allocation



Eligible Applicants

- County-level agency in coordination with cities and communities
- Red Cross
- Have to own the property or provide evidence from property owner allowing to install and operate Clean Air Center
- Religious institutions are not eligible
- One application per County



Application Process

Clean Air Centers



Minimum 5-year operations and maintenance of Clean Air Center required.



Max 24-months to complete installation. Reimbursement within 60 days of installation.



Air District reviews application for eligibility and completeness.



Application per Project type

- 1. Application per facility ventilation upgrade
- 2. One application for portable air cleaners
- 3. One application for air filter replacements

DUE Jan. 30, 2022 Optional Pre-Screening

Optional pre-screening of facility upgrade projects to move forward with full application.





Project Details:

Location:

In or near disadvantaged communities.

Eligible Costs

- Equipment costs for the purpose of air filtration upgrade;
- Installation, including labor, materials (e.g., trenching, wiring, signage, and conduit), and necessary electrical upgrades to meet the demands of the clean air center;
- Maintenance for up to 5 years;

Ineligible Costs

- Pre-assessment/quotes
- Administrative costs
- Operational costs
- Air Quality Monitoring Device
- Environmental review
- Facility approvals and coordination costs
- Costs to improve the clean air center that are not directly related to the project

Location:

Highest need at time of wildfire smoke emergency with priority for disadvantaged communities.

Eligible Equipment

 Portable air cleaners certified by California Air Resources Board for sale and use in California AND equipped with HEPA filter.

Eligible Costs

- Portable air cleaners
- Maintenance for up to 5-years

Ineligible Costs

- Admin
- Labor
- Operations

Purchasing Options

- 1. Buy a <u>CARB certified</u> portable air cleaner directly from vendor and request reimbursement from BAAQMD
- 2. Purchase from BAAQMD Bulk Pricing list. Request type and quantity and BAAQMD will purchase directly and ship

Eligible Equipment

- Air filters rated MERV 13 or greater
- HEPA air filters

Eligible Costs

- Filters
- Maintenance for up to 5-years

Ineligible Costs

- Admin
- Labor
- Operations
