

Technology Implementation Office Clean Cars for All Program (CCFA) Advisory

This Advisory is provided to inform you about Assembly Bill 841 and CA Public Utilities Code 740.20, which affects home charger installations offered by CCFA. It will help you achieve compliance with new CCFA requirements

(EVITP) CERTIFICATION REQUIRED FOR ELECTRIC VEHICLE (EV)

HOME CHARGER INSTALLATIONS

CCFA Program participants who are eligible to apply for the home charger rebate are required to have their EV charger installed by a licensed contractor and EVITP certified electrician. Participant must use a contractor with a valid Contractors State License Board (CSLB) C-10 or C-46 License and at least one electrician on each crew, at any given time, must hold an EVITP certification. One member of each crew may be both the contractor and an EVITP certified electrician. Project EVITP requirements align with California Assembly Bill No. 841 and Public Utilities Code 740.20 and are effective for work performed on or after January 1, 2022.

Participant should check their contractor's license number on the CSLB website (https://www.cslb.ca.gov/OnlineServices/CheckLicenseII/CheckLicense.aspx) to ensure it is current and active. A list of licensed contractors who employ EVITP certified electrician can be found at: https://evitp.org/california. You may also search for EVITP certified electricians by certification number or by last name in the EVITP database (https://db.evitp.org/).

The EVITP certification requirement does not apply to the following:

- Single-family home residential EV chargers that can use an existing 208/240-volt outlet.
- Participants who purchase a portable level 2 charger that can plug into an existing 208/240 volt outlet.

Installations performed by non-licensed contractors and electricians who are not EVITP certified are not eligible for reimbursement. Participant and household members may not perform any installations, even if they are a licensed contractor.
